THREE THOUSAND BADGE WINNERS!

THE success of the Race Walking Association Badge scheme, brought into being just after the War, is made clear by the announcement that the number of athletes who have gained the R.W.A. Badge for walking 6 miles within an Hour in an approved event has reached **THREE THOUSAND**. There are an appreciable number of athletes who have also completed seven miles within an hour and a select list of nine who have, within the same period, covered more than eight miles within 60 minutes. Prior to the scheme W. J. Sturgess, George Lerner, Alf Pope and Fred Redman had also performed the feat making the total number of Amateurs in the top bracket **THIRTEEN**.

But the big interest has been centred around the popular 6-miles-in-the-hour award because this performance has proved to be within the compass of most athletes. There are a few who have won them at the very first attempt. The award of these badges is not confined to members of affiliated Walking clubs and members of any athletic club or even unattached men, can gain them.

To afford such a chance under conditions very favourable for the attempt the Race Walking Association are holding a 6 miles race on the enclosed roads around Battersea Park on Saturday, March 4th. The course is very flat and will consist of three laps of a two-mile circuit. I will be pleased to send details to those interested. Write: 50 Manor View, Finchley, London, N.3.

Leicester Win "Livingston" Points Cup. With the Midland Winter League series now finished Leicester alking Club emerge winners of the competition for the second year running. The competition is on handicap basis and although in the third and last race Leicester dropped to fourth position they had enough in hand to come out winners on aggregate, but by the very narrow margin of 37 seconds over Coventry Godiva **Final Positions:** 1, Leicester 519m. 19s.; 2, Godiva 519.56; 3, Lozells 525.41; 4, Worcester 531.40; 5, Birmingham 539.37.

Essex Beagles' Meeting. There were good fields and very fine racing in the Beagles' Youth-Junior and Boys' races at Chigwell Row. Leicester W.C. dominated the Boys' 1½m. event and had first three home and winning team. I. Randall won in the good time of 15m. 48s. and remains unbeaten this season.

In the Junior race at 3¼m. Maurice Fulla-

ger of Surrey, took the lead from George Turner of Steyning and Shaun Lightman (Met). After a mile Dennis Read was in fourth place and looked the danger. On the second of the two quite stiff laps, Read went up into second place and with a mile to go was on the heels of Fullager. He bided his time and went by 600 yards from home to win by ten yards. Martyn Purser, the stylish Met. boy, was easily first Youth.

The enthusiasm of the younger competitors was most marked and augurs well for the sport.

Harry Wheeler, Yorks W.C. champion in 1957 when he left for New Zealand, is back on holiday and was fourth in his club's Boxing Day race. It is of interest that Wheeler's young brother Frank, who has put up some good performances as a Junior over the Country, was the first man home and also won the handicap. **John Barraclough**, third, continues to improve and is one of the best Junior stylists in the North.

John Edgington, 185 Broomfield Road, Coventry, is now Walking Section Hon. Secretary, Coventry Godiva H.

Southend A.C. promote a Youth-Junior 3¼m. and Boys' 1½m. race on Feb. 18th.

The National 20 Miles Championship is to be held from the Poly H. Ground at Chiswick Stadium on the day of the "Sward" Meeting, May 13th.

The Suffolk R.W.A. have reformed and are keen to revive the Colchester to Ipswich 18-miles race. The date proposed is April 22nd.

INDICTMENT

THE comments of Jim Alford in an interview with Sydney Hulls in the *Daily Express* earlier this week are a damning indictment of officialdom in this country.

Coming from one who is so mild of manner and thinks carefully before he speaks, and whom I have known as a fellow athlete and coach for something like a quarter of a century, I know that Jim's remarks are sincere and not without substance.

Alford criticises the A.A.A. for (1) looking down on the national coaches because they are professionals, (2) distrusting their work and motives, (3) insulting them by sending them to important international events only as observers, and the Welsh officials for resenting instead of welcoming his advice, for sticking to the £250 received from the A.A.S.A. to help pay athletes' travelling expenses and purchase equipment — when there is not one first class javelin in the whole of Wales! In Helsinki in 1952, says Alford, he had to sneak into the Olympic Village like a thief because he was refused a pass.

I know that Jim Alford did not give up his post lightly or without considerable regrets. All the hard work he has put in over the past twelve years will have seemed in vain—though I can assure him that this is not really the case. He has sown the seeds in Wales which another may see bear fruit, but there are enthusiasts in Wales who will ensure that the training camp at Merthyr Mawr carries on, and even if it is an uphill battle, his successor will have had the way paved for him by a coach we could not afford to lose. It is time for a radical change in our (official) attitude towards our national coaches in this country.

GOOD news for visitors to Belgrade in 1962. I have been assured by B.A.A.B. Hon. Secretary, Mr. Jack Crump, that the student town accommodation which we have been offered for the period of the European Championships will be first class. It is a new "university town" with the best possible modern accommodation which, when completed, will be used partly for the athletes and partly for visitors to the Championships, after which it will be used to house students for a new physical education university. I am told we shall not obtain better accommodation anywhere within reasonable reach of Belgrade, and Jack Crump assures me that he, personally, will ensure that British visitors are well looked after. On these assurances we are accepting the accommodation while it is still available and look forward to being as comfortable as we were in Stockholm on the occasion of the last Championships.

CHELMSFORD BEAT RECORD IN BEDFORD RELAY

CHELMSFORD, entering for the first time, beat the course record for the Bedford Boxing Day Road Relay by 56 sec. On the first leg McKim (Kettering) equalled the record when coming in with a second to spare from Bell (Chelmsford), with Jones (Welwyn) only another second away in third place.

On the second stage Merriman took Watford into the lead with a record run to hand over 2 sec. ahead of Edelen (Chelmsford), with Gale (Kettering) third, and Surrey A.C. — also newcomers — now 4th, thanks to Snowden who had taken them up six places.

On stage 4 Dixon held on to the lead for Watford, but Welwyn came up to second after a record run by Wenk. Chelmsford were third, Kettering fourth and Surrey for whom Barham equalled Wenk's new record, fifth.

Brian Hill-Cottingham beat the record for the fifth stage by 51 secs. in taking Chelmsford into a winning lead. Redman brought Watford home 24 sec. down in second place and though Welwyn finished third they were disqualified for running a second claim man, and Surrey moved up to third, Watt running a fast leg which was also inside the old record.

WOMEN'S COACHING COURSE

The Southern Women's A.A.A. in conjunction with the Southern Counties A.A.A. have arranged a young athletes' mixed one week scholarship Course at Bisham Abbey, Berks., from April 6th—13th. The only expense to the young athlete will be the cost of travelling to and from Bisham Abbey.

The object of the Course is to give specialist coaching to athletes of good standard and high potential. Twelve places only are available to women aged 16-21 and preference will be given to candidates unable to obtain specialist coaching in their event. Events will be Hurdles, Long Jump, Shot, Discus and Javelin. The Course will be staffed by Mr. G. H. G. Dyson, Chief National Coach, A.A.A.; Mr. J.
