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CLAYTON v. ADCOCKS IN MANCHESTER MARATHON

VIRTUALLY a world's championship: that is how Sunday's Maxol Marathon, incorporating the AAA and RRC Championships, is shaping up. The contestants who will attract most attention are Derek Clayton (Australia), who has the two fastest times on record (2:08:33.6 and 2:09:36.4) to his credit; Coventry's Bill Adcocks, owner of the next two best marks in history (2:10:47.8 and 2:11:07.2); Olympic silver medalist Kenji Kimihara (Japan), who has run 2:13:25.8 and 2:13:33.4; and Boston winner Yoshiaki Unetani (Japan), credited with 2:12:40.6 and 2:13:49.0.

Yet such is the calibre of the field that there is no guarantee of the winner being one of these four! The British challengers to Adcocks' supremacy include such sub-2:20 performers as Ron Hill (best of 2:14:12), European champion Jim Hogan (2:19:27), Commonwealth champion Jim Alder (2:14:14.4), Juan Taylor (2:15:37), Mike Teer (2:17:37), Don McGregor (2:17:19), Barry Collins (2:19:22), Joe Clare (2:18:43), Mel Edwards (2:18:24.8), Graham Taylor (2:19:04) and Leo Carroll (2:17:12). Others in the field of over 200 include East Germany's Jurgen Busch (best of 2:13:45.2), a representative from Finland and possibly an Ethiopian runner.

The race, which will be started at Manchester Town Hall (2 p.m.) by Sir Matt Busby, ends at Old Trafford Football Stadium. Britain's team selectors for Athens will, of course, be taking a keen interest in the result although one would consider that Bill Adcocks has already done enough to be picked regardless of his performance in this race.

Lynn Against Beamon In Los Angeles

LYNN DAVIES against Bob Beamon and Igor Ter-Ovanesyan is just one of the mouth-watering clashes expected in the USA v. USSR v. British Commonwealth match being staged in Los Angeles this week (July 18th/19th). Of the other British athletes involved, Dave Hemery and Alan Pascoe oppose Willie Davenport and Leon Coleman in the high hurdles, John Sherwood faces Ralph Mann (49.3), Nick Lee (50.0) and Vyacheslav Skomorokhov (49.9) in the 400mH, John Whetton and Ian McCafferty (if fit) take on Marty Liquori and John Mason in the 1500m, Mike Bull tackles world record vaulters Bo's Seagren and John Pennel, Jeff Teale opposes Neal Steinhauer and Randy Matson, Howard Payne has Romuald Klim, Anatoliy Shuplyakov, Tom Gage and George Frenn in the hammer, Dave Travis and John FitzSimons team up against Janis Lusis and Mark Murro, Clive Longe battles against his Commonwealth record as well as Bill Toomey in the decathlon, Paul Nihill walks against Ron Laird and the top Russians over 20km and Martin Winbolt Lewis runs as a member of the 4x400m team.

Other great battles in prospect include John Carlos v. Peter Norman in the 200m, Byron Dyce v. Ralph Doubell in the 800m, Kerry O'Brien v. Viktor Kudinskiy in the steeplechase, Otis Burrell and Dick Fosbury v. the Soviet pair in the high jump, Phil May and Mike McGrath v. Viktor Saneyev in the triple jump. Because of the clash in dates with the WAAA Championships there are no British girls in the Commonwealth team.

English Schools Championships**At Motspur Park, July 11th/12th****1500 Metres CLASSIC WON BY HOLLINGS**

ONCE again, as if by order, a humid sun graced the ESAA Championships and by the end of two days of stunning performances, one went away with one's mind reeling with gigantic feats all clamouring for attention. Three hours of finals on Saturday alone saw some staggering athletics almost exclusively limited to the middle-distance events as international class times were clocked off with astonishing frequency. Sadly, the majority of records achieved were not announced and therefore unapplauded by the large crowd.

**Dave Cocksedge reports
on the boys' events**

The drama was provided by the field events on Friday. Ian Chipchase (17) contemptuously disposed of the two pronged challenge from Essex by hurling the senior 12lb hammer 62.60/205'4"; a massive improvement on Paul Dickenson's Championship best of 59.00/193'7", and his first competitive throw over 200ft. Two of his fouls had spectators scattering as they soared across the turf out of the throwing arc! Anthony Harper (18) who slumped to a lowly 57.50/188'8" in the Southern Junior javelin, unleashed his best throw of the competition with 65.10/213'7" and then waited long agonising minutes as Adrian Diffey's (19) final cast was made and measured . . . it proved too short by 2'11". Geoff Hignett's recent injury held up in the long jump and enabled him to bound out to 7.10/23'3½" into a slight headwind to retain his title. Jon Wood showed fine form to whip the country's best AAA Juniors with the 12lb shot, upping his best to 17.10/56'1½", from a circle that was far from ideal, in the process. Once again Guy Dirkin, guesting, slammed his elders in the senior discus though he fell victim to John Turton's massive 63.20/207'4" in the intermediate event on Saturday. Stuart Tufton raised his best by 1½" to take the pole vault and make amends for last year, and Brian Hull was outstanding in the triple, coming to earth finally 14.99/49'2½" from the board; though this event was the only wind-assisted competition of the two days.

Saturday's senior 1500m final was an all-time classic. For the first time this year, the country's leading junior milers, Phil Banning (18) Paul Dennis (18) and Richard Hollings (19) were matched together; but it was the underrated Raymond Smedley (17) from John Wilmott Grammar School, who nearly stole the race from under their noses. Banning assumed his usual role and cut straight into the lead, but this time he had three passengers as the first lap was clicked off in 58.6. Phil carried on plugging away through

2:01.2 at two laps, but was labouring as he passed the bell in 2:46.2. He was fractionally in front at the 1320 in 3:03.3, but then Smedley took off and quickly opened a ten yard gap into the final bend. Hollings and Dennis struck out after the tall yellow-vested figure and it was the Yorkshire boy who caught his man as they hit the straight. Head-rolling, he punched his way past and won still going away in a great 3:46.5. Only John Rix (3:45.6) and David Wright (3:46.3) have run faster among UK juniors. Smedley's 3:47.2 in second place and Dennis's fine return to form, were immensely pleasing also; not forgetting the gallant Banning who set them up. The 800m final involved a gripping struggle between Martin Mills and Bill Barrows, and it was the Midlander who scraped home, but by a mere two tenths. Mills was the leader as the bell clanged in 54.5, and he kept a safe three yards clear of the charging pack until Barrows launched his kick off the last bend. He never got on terms however, as Martin dug in and tenaciously fought off his taller rival all the way to the string. His 1:50.8 will probably be ratified as an AAA Under 19 record, though Tony Harris and Peter Abell (1:50.9) ran the previous best for 880 yards. A revelation was the massive 2.4 sec improvement by Erwin Hartel

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(17) in third place with 1:51.9, however. Upsets galore were provided in the 100m, where Stephen Alagoa nosed out Paul Pinnington and Ford Dennis, though the grass infield slowed them all to 11.0; in the 200m where Steve White was ignominiously chopped down in the semis, allowing an injured Trevor Rodwell to float to victory, and in the 400m, in which Northern Champion Derek Price found himself outdone along the finishing stretch by the surprising Edward Coffey (19), who nailed him in 48.5. Impressive also, was Peter Beaven's beautifully relaxed execution of the intermediate field, winning in 48.8. Terry Colton and Ian Whittle set a stinging pace in the intermediate 1500m final, but simply had no answer when Barry Smith inevitably burst ahead on the final bend. He nonchalantly kicked home looking around, and won in 3:55.9 (fastest ever by a UK 16-year-old), with last lap of 59.7. The Steeplechasers gave much to relish. Both John Wheway and Kevin Williams swiftly took control of their races and sped home to set championship bests. John whipped through laps of 66.0, 70.2, 71.0, 72.2 and 66.4 in the senior 2000m to win from the vastly improved Steve Mitchell (18); while Kevin cut out his laps in 59.9 and 2:04.8.

My one criticism of an otherwise fantastic meeting was the indifferent manner in which the press were treated. Results were swiftly and efficiently printed, but were then not distributed, and the failure to provide press seats in the stand was inexcusable.

An Astonishing Run By Mary Sonner

IT took diminutive Mary Sonner just 2 min. 12.4 sec. to win the Intermediate 800m title, gain revenge for her defeat in the Southern Championships and grab the world 14-year-old age record she has threatened all season.

Before the final, the race looked to be between the four heat winners: Southern champion Pat Bagley and Ann Dunn of London (and Cambridge H.) and Mary Sonner and Sandra Marquis of Herts (and Watford H.), with Mary and Pat expected to renew their duel from the Southern, which resulted in victory for the Londoner. At the gun Marquis and Bagley took the lead, passing 200m in an estimated 33.0, and the bell in 66 sec, with Sonner close up third. With 350m remaining Sonner shot into the lead, hotly pursued by Bagley and the pair matched strides down the back straight as the crowd's excitement grew. With a furlong remaining Pat went to the front, and it looked as though the Southern race might be repeated. This time, however, Mary was ready and fought back strongly round the final turn to lead into the straight, with Pat realising her effort had failed and noticeably easing. Mary sprinted home a clear winner in 2:12.4, slicing 1.7 off Canadian Joan Dyke's 1968 world best by a 14-year-old, and also picking up the UK age records for 14, 15 and 16-year-olds. Behind Mary, Sandra Marquis was running the race of her life to pip Bagley for second place in 2:14.9.

The Senior and Junior 800m finals also provided fast, exciting races. Liz Barnes (17), who has yet to be extended in an 800m race this year, opened up a gap of almost four seconds on the Senior field with a powerful drive over the last 250m to win in 2:10.0. What Liz (who starts an art course at the University of Kent in September) needs now, as she admits, is the right races, but unfortunately she has not entered for the WAAA Championships this week-end, which could have afforded the same opportunity for a breakthrough as it did for her clubmate Joan Page last season. Christine Tranter (14) took the equivalent of almost two seconds off Doris Dixon's 1967 UK Junior 800m best when winning the Junior title in 2:16.1.

Unheralded and relatively unproclaimed, it was 18-year-old Shara Spragg from Cheltenham who stole the field event honours when she sent the javelin 49.58/162'8", the best by a British athlete this year, fourth on the UK all-time list, and representing a personal improvement of nearly 16 feet. Shara, who now holds the championship records in all three age groups, was one of a number of athletes (others include sprinters Denise Ramsden and Wendy Kavanagh, and long jumper Barbara Barrett) who turned down the opportunity of representing England in the Schools home international this week-end to compete instead at the WAAA Championships.

As expected Denise Ramsden was untroubled in taking the 100m (run on grass) despite having been unable to train for a fortnight beforehand due to tonsillitis and injury. Sue Midgley completed a Senior sprint double for Yorkshire in the 200m with a clear victory in 24.4 into a 0.3m/sec wind. There were rumours that Jenny Bloss's shot victory (at 13.34/43'9½") currently good enough standard for a second string full international place) was her last appearance in athletics before she starts a nursing career; we can ill-afford to lose her. Millfield's Vivien Knowles scored a surprise victory over Jill Lucas in the Senior discus, displaying a versatility over and above the normal call of a pentathlete's duty. Shock elimination in the first round of the Intermediate hurdles was Denise Etheridge, while her co-favourite Blondelle Thompson (reigning Junior champion) hit a hurdle in the final and finished last.

Nnenna Njoku won the Junior hurdles in 11.3 (probably a UK best on grass) but Jenny Richardson's time of 11.5 seemed to exaggerate the gap between them unfairly. Admittedly, I was in no real position to see the finish, the Press being denied such eccentricities as seats in the stand.

Tony Pretty (19) continued his fine progress this season at Twickenham on July 6th, when winning over 2000mSC in 5:43.6, which hoists him into second place on the UK all-time Junior list. Only Colin Taylor of Airedale has run faster among 19-year-olds. More important, however, is Tony's hint to the Junior international team selectors. Finishing 10.4 sec. behind, 16-year-old John Davies (also TVH) hacked his age best by 4.4 sec. with 5:54.0. The day before, after finishing second in the Southern Youth 1000mSC event, John had said to me: "I don't like this 1000m distance; it's too short for me. I can't take a 58.7 first lap like these other lads." Get John on to the 2000m distance, though, and he comes into his own; though I would be the last to call 2:43.9 for the shorter event slouching! . . . She's not British, and therefore the mark does not have any national significance, but I feel it's worth mentioning anyway just to take your breath away. I'm tempted to call it an age record to end age records, in fact. Thirteen-year-old American school girl Debbie Roth ran a mile in 4:59.6 in Oregon on June 14th!

FOREIGN STARS FOR CHAMPIONSHIPS

Women's Athletics

LAST year's WAAA Championships were hailed as the greatest ever but the indications are that the 1969 version, at Crystal Palace this weekend, will prove to be even more memorable. The overseas entry is one of remarkable quality: three reigning Olympic champions in Irena Szewinska (Pol), Viorica Viscopoleanu (Rum) and Lia Manoliu (Rum); seven world record holders in Szewinska (22.5 200m), Viscopoleanu (6.82/22'4" LJ), Italy's Paola Pigni (4:12.4 1500m), Holland's Maria Gommers (4:36.8 mile), Poland's Tereza Sukniewicz (13.3 100mH), Yugoslavia's Vera Nikolic (2:00.5 800m) and Formosa's Chi Cheng (26.2 200mH); plus such other world class performers as Anneloes Bosman (4:22.7 1500m), Tilly van der Made (53.2 400m, 2:04.4 800m) and Els Van Noorduy (17.09/56'0" SP) from the Netherlands; Tereza Nowak (13.4 100mH) from Poland; and Marjana Lubej (10.6 80mH) from Yugoslavia. Not yet confirmed is the participation of Olympic pentathlon champion Ingrid Becker (WG), co-holder of the 100mH world record and ex-Olympic champion Karin Balzer (EG) and the second highest jumper of all-time, Rita Schmidt (EG).

The presence of these overseas stars, financed by Bovril's £4,000 sponsorship of the meeting, will ensure several intriguing battles at the highest possible level. Take the sprints: Irena Szewinska v. Dorothy Hyman! Such a clash, between the two outstanding European sprinters of the last decade, ought on its own merit to draw a big

crowd, never mind about a re-match between the two fastest 1500m girls of all time (Pigni and Gommers), or the opportunity for Sheila Sherwood to defeat her Olympic conqueror, or the appearance of several of the world's greatest hurdlers, or Vera Nikolic v. Pat Lowe, or . . . or . . .

Yes, a tremendous meeting it should be, marred only by the absence of a few British top-liners like Rosemary Stirling, Sue Scott and—if her back injury does not respond sufficiently to treatment—Lillian Board. The selectors of the British team for Athens will be largely influenced by the results, so the competition will be fierce in all events. A good move, which will give more girls a chance of showing their worth, is that there will be eight finalists in those events (including field) where six has until now been the norm.

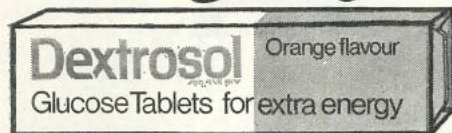

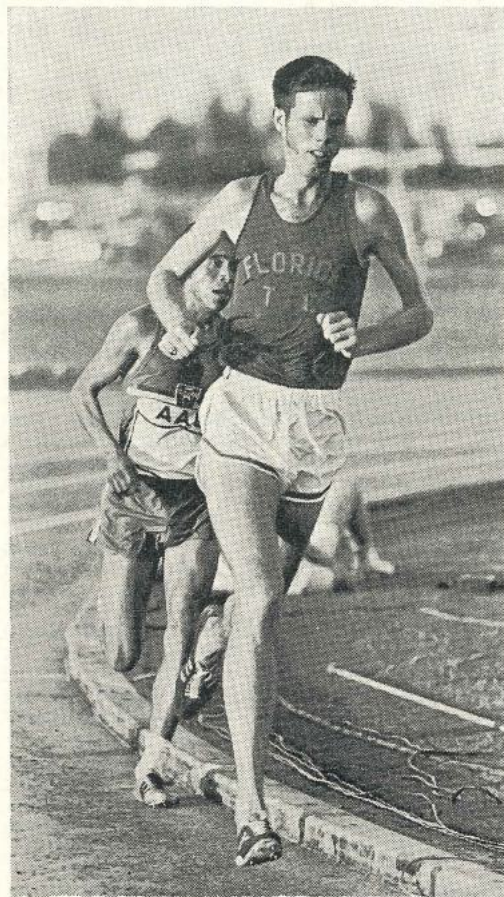

Southern ChampionshipsAt Crystal Palace, July 11th/12th**DAVE BEDFORD REVIVES MEMORIES**

REMINISCENT of Stan Eldon and Mel Batty in their heyday, Dave Bedford led from gun to tape to score a brilliant victory in the Southern 5000m championship in 13:42.8, a time that only Alan Blinston has bettered among UK athletes this season. It was a devastating performance on a warm, muggy afternoon, and re-emphasises that in this lean 19-year-old Shaftesbury Harrier we have a very precious talent indeed. Any who thought that early season UK 10,000m record was just a flash in the pan will have to think again.

Shadowed throughout by Geoff North, Bedford churned out his laps in 63.2, 65.0, 65.2, 66.2, 66.8, 67.0, 67.6, 67.4, 68.2, 67.6, 65.4, 63.2 and 30.0 for the last 200m. The last 800m, in 2:06, was particularly impressive for North was ready to pounce at the sign of any weakness and yet Bedford raised the pace when it was hurting most. Both set personal bests in smashing the European qualifying standard, while Roger Matthews continued his remarkable advance this season by breaking 14 min. for the first time. Another notable personal best came from Richard Newble, and 36-year-old Jim Hogan sharpened up for the Maxol Marathon with his fastest time for some seasons.

The Championships, among the best of recent years, threw up two other new European qualifiers in Martin Winbolt Lewis, who demolished the 400m opposition with a fierce finishing drive (Colin Campbell, who entered the straight almost level, tied up rather drastically), and Gerry Stevens who followed up his good run at the Helsinki World Games (where he beat Amos Biwott among others) with a scintillating, "solo" personal best of 8:39.2.

Ian Green and Dave Dear accounted for some fine sprinting, though mention must be made also of Bob McStocker who clocked 10.7 and 21.5 in his first serious races of the season. John Boulter, striking 220m from the tape, was untroubled in taking the 800m (his second lap was close to 52 sec.) and should be in with as good a chance as anyone come the AAA. Incidentally, Allan Cowen—so often an obliging pacemaker—set a personal best in the heats and reached his first Southern senior final after a decade of trying.

The 1500m unveiled a promising newcomer in Marine Corporal Jim Douglas (23), who began running only 18 months ago while stationed in Singapore and whose only coaching has come from text books. His 3:45.0 victory recently in the Navy Championships sounded good, and he looked even better as he toured the first lap here in 58.9. Andy Green led through 800m in 2:00.5 and the bell in 2:47.4 but was powerless to hold Douglas when he went from 300m. Covering that final sector in 41.1 (56.3 for his last lap) Douglas ran out a comfortable winner in 3:43.8 showing every indication of being capable of shaking up all our more established milers. Green slipped to

4th as Maurice Wands and relentlessly improving Phil Thomas drove home for lifetime bests.

Dave Travis, who withdrew after his great throw at Brno because he feels he normally has only one good throw in a series, did not fall below 253ft. with any of his five valid efforts: 78.34, foul, 77.68, 77.30, 78.24, 77.70. He needed to throw well, for a rejuvenated John McSorley opened the competition with his longest for seven years, 76.60/251'4". Neville Hart-Ives got caught up in the spirit of things by adding over ten feet to his previous best, and another comparative veteran Bill Bushnell also broke new ground. Fred Alsop collected his tenth triple jump title in the absence of Tony Wadhams; Mike Cushion followed up his inter-county discus success with another victory—a far cry from his 7th place of last year. The best event, competitively, was the long jump. Alan Lerwill, gaining tremendous height, won easily enough in his first competition for several weeks but there was an enthralling tussle for second. Ken Snelgrove occupied that position from the first round until, with his final jump, Peter Hudson overtook him by a centimetre and John Mitchell fell short by just 2cm.

The pole vault was cancelled after the seven competitors refused to vault in the conditions offered them. Martin Higdon, who had already forfeited a competition at Grangemouth this season for similar reasons, protested that the gusting headwind would endanger vaulters as it could either blow them back on to the runway or, worse, on to the pit's concrete surrounds. A request that the event be held in the opposite direction was refused by officials—and so the vaulters walked out, preferring to stage their own unofficial championship at Hemel Hempstead the following day. I say good luck to them. After Dave Lease's serious injuries earlier this season. Britain's vaulters are more sensitive than ever towards potentially dangerous situations, and who is to blame them. Pole vaulting is quite hazardous enough without the worries of breaking the odd bone or two upon landing.

Letter to the Editor

HAMMER THROWING AT CRYSTAL PALACE

Dear Sir,

I have just read in your issue of July 12th the letter from Colin Collis, in which he refers to the cancellation of the Hammer event at the Southern Junior and Youths Championships at Crystal Palace. It is also mentioned in your report of the meeting in the same issue. The letter quoted from the Southern Championships Secretary puts the blame squarely on the Director of the Crystal Palace National Recreation Centre, whilst your report mentions the ground staff.

Whatever the circumstances, it brings to a head a situation which has been boiling up for some time, and which has now got to be faced and put right. Ever since the Crystal Palace track opened there has been an antipathy towards the Hammer event, and on numerous occasions it has been banished to the playing field behind the Sports Hall. It happened this year on June 16th in the meeting between Southern Counties, UAU, PE Colleges and Scottish Universities, at which a number of distinguished throwers took part. It also happened last year at the meeting held to inaugurate the new Tartan track. It would have happened at the LAC Schools Meeting this year had not strong representations been made in advance.

This situation is really not good enough at a track which makes claim to provide a new home for British Athletics—as quoted in a recent article by the Director, Emlyn Jones, in the AAA Club Newsletter. There is an inescapable link between the Crystal Palace and the GLC and the latter (with the LCC before it) has always banned Hammer throwing from London tracks, with the single exception of competition events at Hurlingham. During the last 15 years, the Hammer Circle has made repeated approaches to the GLC and LCC Parks Department, the BAAB, the AAA, and one individual member even wrote to the Duke of Edinburgh, as President of the Board, asking for these restrictions to be relaxed. The response has been NIL—there have not been and still are not any Hammer training facilities at any GLC track. We know the LCC provided and paid for the Crystal Palace NRC, but surely the CCPR who run it as an independent body do not have to maintain this dog in the manger attitude. If they claim to provide a "Home for Athletics" they must also provide training and competition facilities for every Olympic event, and the latter must be staged inside the Stadium where they can be watched and appreciated by spectators.

If they are not prepared to do this, and are going to single out the Hammer event for relegation outside the arena, then they are not fulfilling

their responsibilities, and the BAAB and AAA should reconsider whether they are right in moving their international meetings there from the White City, and Clubs should ask the same question of their own meetings. Since it was formed in 1952 the Hammer Circle has worked constantly for the provision and improvement of facilities for the event, and it will take up this issue with as much vigour as any it has previously fought for.

We will undoubtedly discuss it at our forthcoming AGM in September and I propose to put a motion to members that whenever in future a Hammer event is staged away from the main arena, whether at the Crystal Palace, Twickenham or Kingston, Jamaica, all competitors will decline to take part. At a time when the national standard in our event is rising, and we can hold our own in international competition, we must not allow the short-sightedness—or stubbornness—of certain track authorities to deny us full facilities.

One suspects that the Crystal Palace ground staff do not like the green surface of the arena to be marked by Hammers landing on it. Let me emphasise that this is exactly what the central area of any track is for, and the more pock-marked it is the better it is fulfilling its purpose. In any case the ground staff can keep it level and in good condition if they fill in the holes and smooth the turf after each period of use. The Hammer throwers will even do this themselves after training periods. If in doubt the National Association of Groundsmen run courses which they could attend, at which they could learn the technique.

I hope that I have stated the case in unequivocal terms, and I emphasise that I do so with the support of the Chairman of the Hammer Circle, Don Vanhegan, who is in close touch with our active members. I would now invite comment from the Director of the Crystal Palace, the Secretaries of the BAAB and the AAA, and possibly even the GLC. On this issue we want to know just where they—and we—stand.

Dennis Cullum and the Hammer Circle have an unanswerable case, I would have thought. Earlier in the season, when there was concern in some quarters that the inter-counties hammer event at the Crystal Palace might be relegated to the out-back, I asked Emlyn Jones what was the policy for staging hammer competitions. He replied that, as he was called upon to maintain the infield as a football pitch, it was impracticable to permit frequent hammer competitions. For major events where a crowd is present the hammer would be staged in the main arena, but for lesser meetings it would have to be held outside. This compromise arrangement, however, seems to have fallen through, judging by the policy in relation to the Southern Junior—a major event, surely. In any case the Crystal Palace, if it is to live up to its reputation of being among the world's most ad-

vanced track and field arenas, must offer hammer throwing facilities without any ifs or buts. The poor hammer thrower is treated as a second class citizen-athlete all too often as it is, without the new Mecca of British athletics adding further humiliation. On the subject of possible boycotting of meetings where the event is staged away from the main arena (Howard Payne, of course, has already given a lead in this direction), this may in some cases bring erring organisers and groundsmen to their senses but, I fear, it may harden others to omitting the event altogether from their programmes. Again, a directive from the governing bodies could be helpful.—Editor.

World Records In Switzerland
