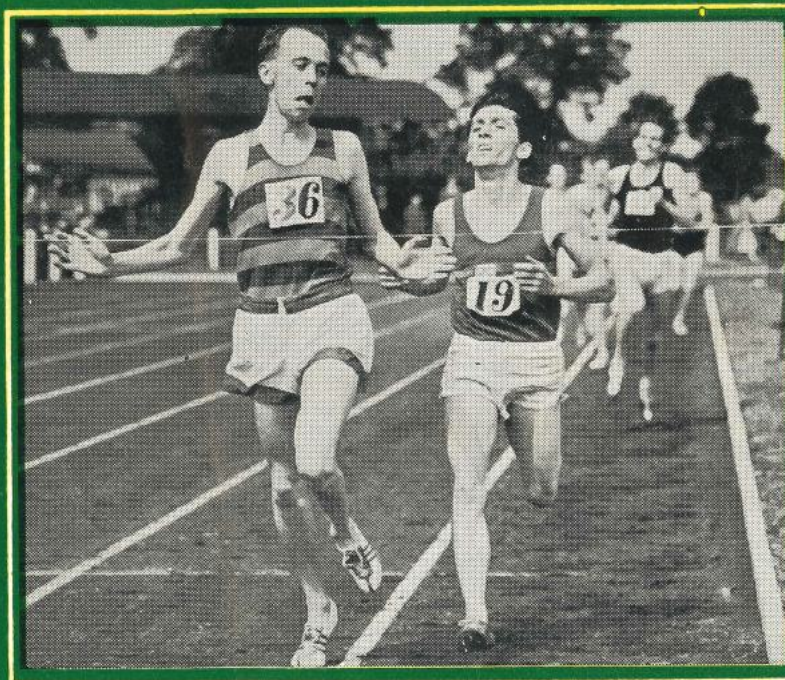

POLY MARATHON

NEVER in the history of the A.A.A. or Polytechnic Marathons has there been a victory who has created greater surprise than the sturdily built Colin Kemball, from Wolverhampton. Colin, a 30 year old employed by his local Gas Board as an industrial representative, simply stole a march on his more fancied rivals. They had not bargained for anything like this performance from one who had previously had only one marathon under his belt; although his 75.39 over an accurately measured course in the Stafford "15" was a shocker! Indeed the only person who fancied Colin's chances was, strangely enough, one of his chief rivals—Eric Smith. Eric reasoned that Colin's build-up over the last two years, during which time he had occasionally been prominent in distance events, would begin to pay dividends now that the weekly schedule had reached the 90 miles region.

When Field Marshal the Rt. Hon. Earl Alexander of Tunis, set the near record field of 194 in motion at 3.45 p.m., on Saturday, 28th June, the weather was warm but dull and the air laden with moisture after two days of incessant rainfall. The Bucks Police, with their customary efficiency, piloted the mass of competitors through their busy area in a manner worthy of the highest admiration and for which competitors and officials alike are grateful; indeed without this generous co-operation the first few miles of the Poly marathon would be a danger to the competitors and could end in chaos on the public highway.

After 26 minutes and a few seconds the head of the field reached 5 miles, but it was impossible to pin-point a leader since 27 numbered bodies represented one solid mass of humanity. By 8 miles the number was reduced to 11, but the remaining 16 had formed a rear-guard only 50 yards behind. Ten miles up in 52.45 and the leaders were reduced to 7 in number—Kemball, Keily, Kirkup, Wilkinson, Norris, Haslam and Clark. Gruber was only 10 yards away and the remainder followed in close proximity. Three miles later the groups began to lessen, Clark had been dropped from the leading group and behind Ron came a single line at various intervals in this order—Gruber, Pawson, Shrimpton, Len Jones, Fleming-Smith, Pape, Eric Smith, Hicks, Pawsey and Honney.

Fifteen miles in 1.19.15 reduced the leaders to 6 with Haslam only 10 yards down, but the others had eased considerably and could scarcely be detected amongst the throng of cyclists and cars which were following the race. A 6 a.m. start may one day become

necessary! Peter Wilkinson was next to become detached and at 18 miles Kemball slipped away so smoothly and effortlessly from Norris, Kirkup and Keily, that they—so it seemed—did not appear to notice; nor did they have much chance for within one mile Colin was 100 yards away and only then did Eddie Kirkup step up the pace in pursuit. Fred Norris was having it pretty grim at this point with a stomach upset and he wisely eased and hoped for the best that never came and it was indeed regrettable that this great little champion had to suffer agonies in order to reach Chiswick. Just one of those things which befalls us all from time to time and best written-off as a bad debt and conveniently forgotten.

Kemball, passing 20 miles in 1.46.00, was now 43 seconds ahead of Keily and Kirkup. Wilkinson had passed Norris to clock 1.47.00, and Haslam was creeping up on the lot with his 1.47.05. Throughout the closing stages the Wolverhampton boy never looked like losing his grip and kept a minute ahead despite frantic efforts by Arthur Keily to close the gap; in so doing Arthur left Eddie, but Wilkinson had made a great recovery just before Haslam was about to overtake him at 23 miles; Jack, unfortunately, had a severe attack of cramp at this critical stage and was forced to ease and see a trip to Cardiff fade away. Then came Adolph Gruber into the picture after severe censure for cutting corners from Referee Squire Yarrow. The popular 38 year-old sports master from Vienna came into the Stadium behind Arthur Keily but, like a ballet-dancer, clowning his way past Arthur to acknowledge the plaudits of the appreciative crowd. This was Adolph's best personal performance and lowers his own Austrian record.

There were many other excellent performances which must not be overlooked in this estimation of high values. Near misses into international priority zone were those of veteran Len Jones, Ken Honney and Bob Pape, which make a fellow realise how our standards rise yearly. Equally commendable was the efficient clock work, Poly machination — *piece de resistance* of Arthur Winter — into which the A.A.A. had confidently placed their highly prized A.A.A. and Southern Marathon Championships for incorporation, an honour which the Poly accept with humble gratitude.

IN THE ZATOPEK MOULD

STAN ELDON really hit the headlines at Chiswick on Saturday, and seems certain to be one of our greatest ever distance runners in the Zatopek mould.

I am sure it will seem amazing to most followers of the sport except some of the old fashioned diehards, and certainly to all connected with athletics in other countries, that Eldon receives no concessions where his police duties are concerned. To think that a man who has just set new British records at six miles should then have to go back to night duty on the beat strikes me as being quite fantastic. Admitted, any man must expect to do his share of work, whatever his occupation, but surely things can be arranged a little better than this.

Eldon's transfer to the six miles brings in one of our most promising runners in Mike Bullivant to take his place in the Empire "3". Colin Kemball, who provided one of the greatest ever surprises by winning the Poly Marathon, joins three well established distance men in Keily, Wilkinson and Kirkup for the Empire Games Marathon. The selection of McCorquindale (Met. Police) for the shot surprised many, as did that of Wyers (Darlington) for the triple jump, but it confirms the policy of the selectors in giving some of our promising young athletes an opportunity of gaining the inspiration of top class competition. Gordon Pirie's selection for the three miles was expected, and the delay in announcing it seemed unnecessary.

IT was nice to meet Arthur Wint again at Chiswick and he looks as fit as ever. One of our most popular athletes, Arthur will always be a welcome visitor to our shores.

OVERSEAS NEWS and some readers' letters have had to be held over until next week, when the Southern Junior Championships will be published complete. The English, Scottish, Welsh and N. Irish teams for the Empire Games will also be given, and, if space allows, the first batch of the Junior "Top Ten." Readers will be interested to know that the issues for July 19th, July 26th, and August 2nd will be enlarged to 24 pages. The July 19th issue will contain a most comprehensive preview of the Empire Games and competitors, while the August 2nd number will be a Special Empire Games number with by far the most comprehensive summary of results we have had for such an event.

The main events of a heavy programme this week-end are the Scottish Junior Championships, Southern Junior Championships (2nd day), and the British Police Championships at London's White City, where the invitation events include many home and overseas stars. The Wakefield "20" incorporates the Yorkshire Championship.

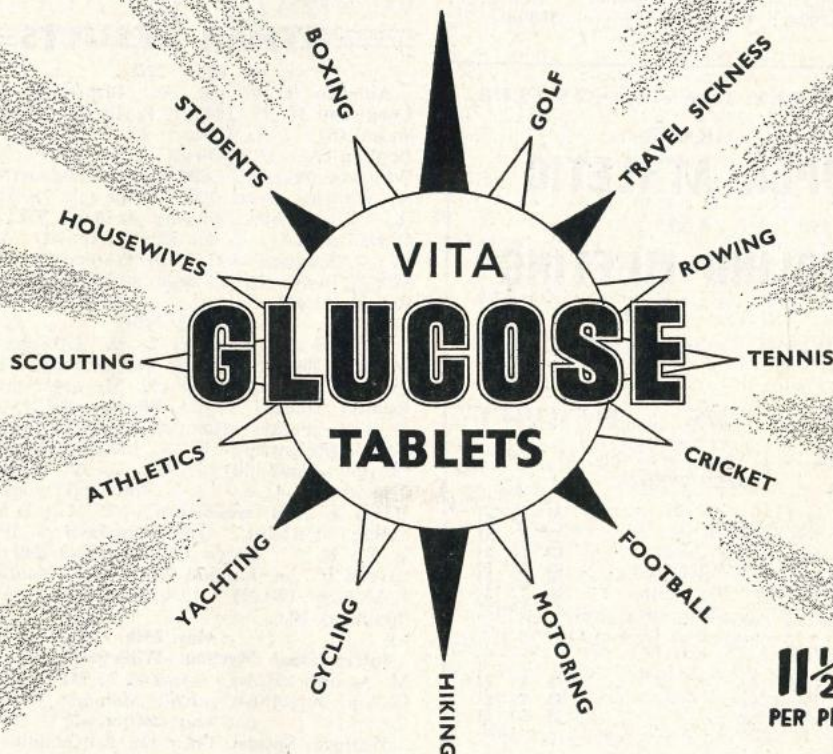

ELDON'S NEW RECORDS AT KINNAIRD MEETING

OUTSTANDING features of the Poly H.
 Kinnaird Meeting at Chiswick on June
 28th, were Eldon's record 6 miles and
 the defeat of Peter Radford by Dave Segal
 in the 100 yards. Nearly a yard up at half-
 way, Segal had to pull out all the stops to
 hold off his Midland rival in the last 20 yards.
 He had a far easier victory in the furlong.

A rather tired Don Smith paid the penalty
 in the 880 of allowing a slow run race and
 could not match Rawson in the final sprint
 for home. Many expected Disley to take
 the mile, but after doing practically all the
 leading, he had to give best to Gordon down
 the final straight.

Another surprise was the defeat of Wooley

 but without avail. A lap later Eldon went by
 fast and tried to get away, but Foord closed
 the gap. Heatley was now third, 40 yards
 down. Wild came through to third approach-
 ing the two miles (9:11.4) and at 2½ miles

Eldon made another attempt to get away from
 his shadow and this time he succeeded. Just
 before the 3 miles (13:51.2!) Hyman had come
 through to third place, with Redrup 4th and
 Wood (RAF) 5th.

Bullivant went to 4th just before the four
 miles (18:36.0) and Hyman went past Foord
 but was repassed before the end of the straight.
 Eldon was now well ahead and went through
 5 miles in 23:25.6 for a new Native record.
 He continued on his way and finished with
 a storming last half lap to set new British
 All-Comers', National and English Native
 records with 28min. 5 sec. With half a mile to
 go Hyman had moved up in front of Foord
 but could not get away, and when it came to
 the final burst down the straight Foord was
 much too fast for him. Bullivant and Heatley
 had been having a ding-dong struggle for
 fourth place, the former just having the edge

MY reference to the progress and outcome of the team race was cut last week, but we must record that Belgrave won their third consecutive victory after Met, had led up to halfway. I was in error in giving four wins to Don Thompson, it is **three**. His sequence has been 8th, 2nd, 1st, 1st. Albert Johnson beat Thompson and the Swedes—the Soderlund Brothers—at Coventry in 1955 and walked a great race. His effort last week was a very unfortunate one for him, particularly as the result has bearing upon the European Games selection. Johnson lost the heel of a shoe as early as seven miles out, which started up a blister, and then a nail began protruding into his heel. Despite this Johnson was only a yard off the leader, Tom Misson, at 25km., halfway. Then the handicap began to tell and when Johnson did stop for first-aid, kindly given by the Woodford Green group, his heel was in a sorry state.

Incidentally, regarding the accuracy of the distance, in an independent survey I differed by only four yards per lap of over 6 1/2 miles with the measurements prepared by Mr. Arthur Whitehead, who does so much for the Belgrave Road races, and am well satisfied that the course is the full distance within these fine limits.

Don Thompson and Tom Misson, first two last week, walk in the Belgian 50km. at Charleroi on Sunday, and unless some of the fast Russians are in attendance I think they will get first two places again.
