

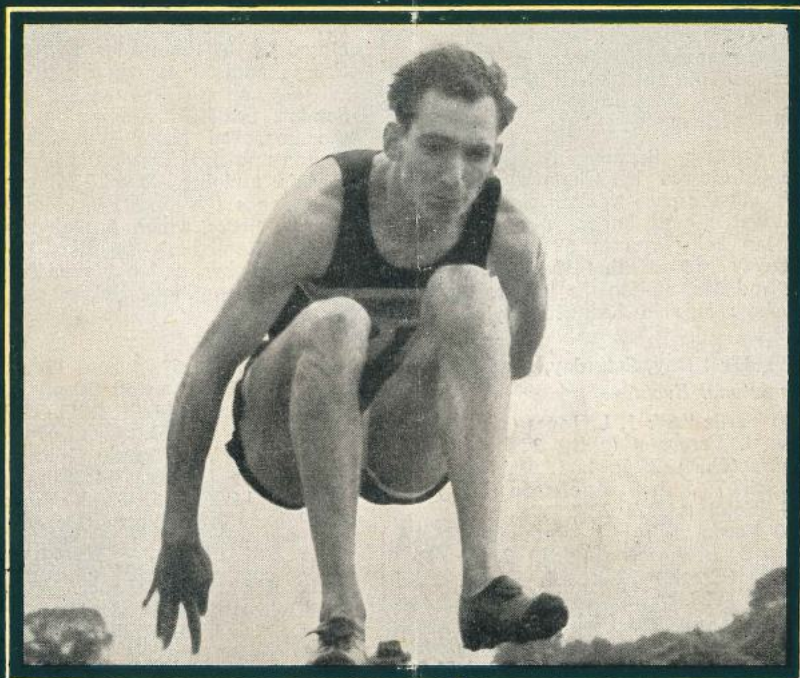

# THE BRITISH GAMES

THE star of the meeting was undoubtedly Chris Chataway, who failed by only .6 of a second to beat the world record of 8min. 40.4sec. for two miles. If ever a man deserved to beat record, it was Chataway, and the fact that he broke only the British and English records was due almost entirely to poor pacemaking.

Surely, in Bannister, there was a runner capable of taking him through six laps in 6min. 30sec. with reasonably equal lap times. In actual fact, however, Green led for a lap run in 62.2, then Brasher took over and the pace slowed down, the benefit of the fastish first lap being lost with one of 67.4. Bannister took over at 2½ laps, the third taking 64.2, and the next dropping to 66.6, where the first damage was done.

At 4½ laps Brasher again took over, closely followed by Chataway and Jungwirth, but the pace was too slow and it was here that record hopes were dashed, the fifth lap being run in 68 secs. Though Chataway realised that the pace was too slow and dashed into the lead to cover the last three laps in beautiful style in 65.0,

64.6, and 63.0, it was asking almost the impossible of any athlete to pull back so much lost time. Chataway's effort was one of the most magnificent pieces of running I have ever seen and it was sheer tragedy that his pacemakers let him down so badly.

On the first day Derek Johnson stole the thunder with his 1:50.2 half-mile, after Hewson had led the field through a 54.2 sec. first quarter. In the international race Nankeville ran a similar first quarter of 54.2 with Grogan in close attendance at the bell. Bannister then went away, but Jungwirth never lost touch, and round the last bend closed up to the leader and tore past the tiring Bannister to win in 1:50.7.

Time and space allows but a mention of Sando's beautiful running in the 6 miles, the improved Kane and K. E. Johnson, Sexton's suicidal first 220 which also led to Fryer's undoing, Derek Johnson's battles with Jones (U.S.A.), Pirie's ill-judged first mile of three which probably cost him a record, Remigino's sprinting, Wilmshurst's triple jumping, and our superfluity of class milers but continued lack of class sprinters.

It is important to note that some meetings in Eire are held under the jurisdiction of the N.A. and C.A. of Ireland, a body which is banned by the International Federation, and any athletes competing at any of their meetings render themselves liable to suspension from competition under A.A.A. rules.

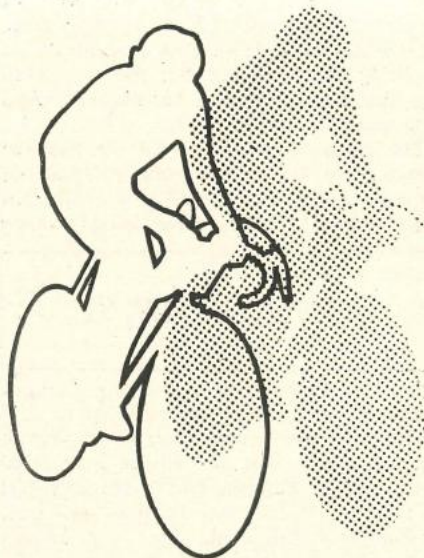

After winning his heat in 10.9, Ken Jones had the misfortune to be badly 'left' in the final of 100m. and finished last. In the 200m. he made amends by beating all but Golliday, of U.S.A.

Kane hurdled well to take the 400m. event comfortably, while Savidge was an easy winner of the weight as well as getting a second with the discus. The Australians, Warren and Ormsby, were obviously in need of competition in their events. Evans ran well against first rate opposition, and Disley was a comfortable second in the 5,000m., though finding Schade a little too good for him.

# CZECHOSLOVAK ATHLETICS

**W**HAT Emil Zatopek has in store for pen-pal Gordon Pirie was revealed in his first race of the season when he bowled through 5,000 metres in 14 mins. 4 secs., one second short of his best ever time for the distance, in trials for the European championships "possibles" at Houstka, Stara Boleslav, mid-May.

*(Zatopek has run 5,000m. in 13:57.2, 10,000m. in 28:54.2, and 6 miles in 27:59.2 since this was written).*

These trials were the wind-up to an early season mustering of the outstanding Czechoslovak athletes, a preparatory camp which lasted for some three weeks. This gives some idea of how seriously the Czechoslovaks are taking their preparations for Switzerland.

Zatopek, of course, always takes his training seriously, and he has been putting in more kilometres than ever during the winter, running seven days a week as is his usual. These long distances have given rise to differences of opinion between Zato-

pek and some of the coaches, who feel that he should, particularly in the racing season, cut his distances down and concentrate on acquiring more speed. But the Iron Man says that his way is best for himself. And he appears to know.

The interesting thing about the trials at Houstka was that this time Zatopek was not alone in putting up a good performance at this distance. Others have been training

seriously for the first time along Zatopek lines and obviously benefiting from it.

Last year, the second best Czechoslovak performance to that of Zatopek over 5,000 metres, when Zatopek had a season's best of 14 mins. 3 secs., was 14 mins. 44.4 secs. by Stanislav Jungwirth, the 1,500 metres champion. In this year's first outing, as will be seen in the results, Ulsberger ran the distance in 14mins. 33.6 secs., which not only beat Jungwirth's time of last year, but was 34.4 seconds inside Ulsberger's best 1953 time.

There were also improvements in the performances of those who finished immediately behind Ulsberger, Koubek improving by 11.4 seconds, Tomis by 11.2 seconds, Slavicek by 32.4 seconds, Svajgr by 7.4 seconds, and Santrucek by 13 seconds, all as a result of hard training throughout the winter along Zatopek lines and continuing this into the Spring training.

Many of the athletes, particularly the army athletes, have had a whole series of training camps, beginning with a fortnight together ski-ing in the mountains early this year. They subsequently visited Houstka for a couple of army training camps and topped these with the national training camps.

The interesting point is that at long last Zatopek's training methods have been vindicated at home, where they have been confined largely to Zatopek himself. Another is that indications are there that a successor to Zatopek, although still very much imma-

## Zatopek's Record 5,000m.

Zatopek's answer to the trouble over his visa was to set a new 5,000m. world record of 13min. 57.2sec. After the race he ran a lap of honour to the accompaniment of tumultuous applause from the crowd.

The Czech took the lead from the start and from 300 metres it was a procession as he reeled off lap after lap all on his own until he caught the tail-enders later in the race. He finished with a last lap of 61.2. After the race he mentioned that Pirie was a younger athlete who was already only 5 or 6 seconds from his best time.

Zatopek's lap times were: 66.8, 66.7, 66.6, 66.9, 67.4, 67.4, 65.8, 69.8, 66.4, 69.6, 69.0, and the last 600m. took 94.8.

In the 100m. final, Janecek finished 5th, limping badly, and did not start in the 200m.

ture, can be seen in young Ulsberger. The absence of good distance runners apart from Zatopek has given rise to much worry in official circles here. I noticed the other day that the national chief coach, Havelka, was taking the marathon runners to task for not doing nearly enough work in training. The same could have been said of the track distance runners up to this season.

After having gone through last autumn and winter training the Zatopek way, walker Josef Dolezal excelled himself in the trials by making a new world record of 2 hrs. 33 mins. 9.4 secs. for 20 miles, against Mikaelsson's 2 hrs. 39 mins. 31 secs., the previous record. Dolezal's intermediate times were: 5 kilometres, 24:00.4; 10. 47:29.0; 15, 1:10:59.4; 20, 1:34:36.8; 25, 1:58:56.8; 30, 2:22:40. This performance must rate Dolezal high among the probables for the European 50 kilometres road title.

Stanislav Jungwirth, record-holder at the distance, showed himself to be in fine form already by getting over 800 metres in 1 min. 50.4 secs., and the half-mile in 1 min. 51.1 secs. Even more impressive was the fact that Jungwirth was not out on his own at the finish, a fact which should encourage the Czechs in their quest for world records in the relays at 4 x 800 metres and 4 x 880 yards.

In the field events, the most noteworthy performances were those recorded in throw-

ing the hammer, as the following first six places will show: 1 Malek; Central Army House, 191ft. 3½in.; 2 Maca, Red Star, 188 ft. 5½in.; 3 Dadak, Spartak, 186 ft. 9¾in.; 4 Engl, Central Army House, 183 ft. 9¾in.; 5 Kypta, Central Army House, 183 ft. 4¾in.; 6 Riedl, Red Star, 179ft. 1¼in.

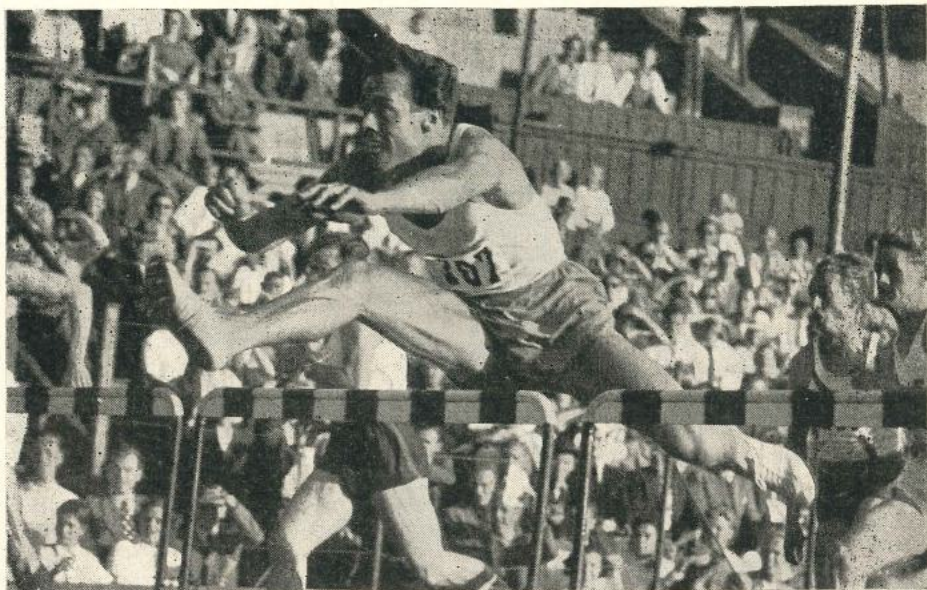

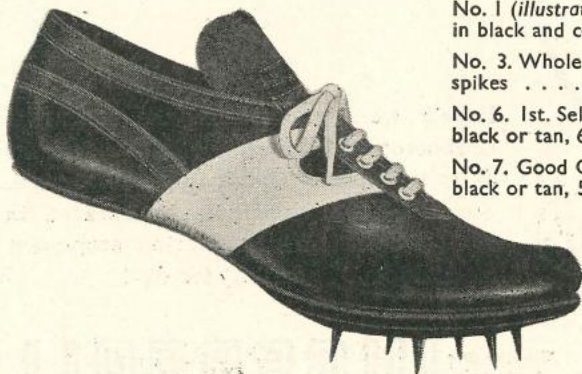
