EVERY SATURDAY — NINEPENCE

SOME years ago it was realised that too many people were getting onto the centre of the ground at most meetings.

The pendulum now seems to have swung the other way and it has become an obsession with many organisers to keep everyone possible from the holy of holies. Though spectators must be able to see what is going on, it should never be forgotten that officials organise meetings and perform their allotted tasks for the benefit of the athletes. I know all about athletics now being "big business" but that applies only to a few of the major meetings and, even then, athletes *must* have reasonable facilities for warming-up and team managers *must* have reasonable access to their teams.

No-one wants to see dozens of people on the centre who have no need to be there but in my view this business is being taken a little too far at some meetings. Furthermore, if some members of the Press are to be excluded, only the Press Stewards should be permitted access to the centre—as is the case at most White City meetings.

Poison Pen

It was most regrettable that we should have this kind of thing entering athletics. I cannot believe that any athletes were responsible for the offensive letter received by Derek Ibbotson at the British Games. Like all other sports, athletics does have a few "big heads" but no-one who knows Derek would ever dream of applying this term to him, and I can only assume that it was the work of ignoramuses who still don't realise that warming-down after a race is just commonsense and not acclamation-seeking. Derek is a grand lad and those who have come to know him well during his stay in the South are sorry to find him returning to his native North. We have enjoyed having him with us as much as I believe he has enjoyed being amongst his new-found friends in the South.

Odds and Ends

I understand that the reference we made recently to a junior steeplechase has had very excellent results and that some sixteen young athletes have expressed a desire to take part.

"Athletics Weekly" will be organising a party to the European Championships in Stockholm next year. To combine this with the best possible holiday, a 13 day (or 15 day if desired) sea trip with 8 nights (or ten) in Stockholm has been selected from the list of the tours which will be advertised next week by World Sport & Travel Service. The cost, without stadium seats, will be just over £50. I shall be pleased to hear from anyone interested in joining the party. If desired, payment can be made by instalments.



World News

U.S.A.

THE United States long awaited four minute miler arrived in the person of Donald Paul Bowden at Stockton (California) on June 1st. Actually, Bowden very nearly failed to arrive—for he had to rush from an examination room in Berkeley and reached the stadium only just in time! With barely time to warm up he lined up as an additional runner in the Pacific Association Athletic Union championship mile.

By the end of the first lap Bowden led the five man field by eight yards in 59.7. At the half way mark his time was 2:0.8 (61.1) and his lead had grown to 20 yards; and at the bell he was 40 yards up in 3:0.6 (59.8). Despite the absence of competition Bowden fought all the way to return a 58.1 last lap for a superlative 3:58.7—equal fifth best time ever. Bowden won by 80 yards over Jack Wilcox, 4:13.2.

Bowden, a 6'3", 11st, 6lb. Californian, was only 20 years and nine months at the time of the race. His previous best mile was only 4:8.2, although in the weeks prior to his great achievement he had been clocked at 4:1.5 in a relay and had run a 1:47.8 half mile.

Bowden took up running at the age of 15 and by the following year had clocked a 1:57.1 880 yards. In 1954, aged 17, he set a U.S. schoolboy record of 1:52.3 and improved to 1:51.5 and 4:11.7 in 1955. He was injured for much of last season, but succeeded in making the Olympic team with a 3:48.6 1500 metres. At Melbourne he was eliminated in the heats (as was Landy four years earlier).

The great Compton Invitational meeting, held on May 31st, produced its usual crop of top-class performances. Best race was the 120 yards hurdles, in which Olympic champion Lee Calhoun equalled his personal best with a brilliant 13.5. Unfortunately for Calhoun this was good only for third place! Ahead of him were Milton Campbell and Elias Gilbert, both timed at a legal 13.4—equal to Jack Davis' world mark. Gilbert's performance was particularly astounding for at Los Angeles the previous week Gilbert finished four yards behind Campbell and Calhoun in a wind aided 14.1, and at Stockton, on June 1st, he was beaten 14.0—14.1 by Calhoun.

Max Truex fulfilled all the hopes held out for him by covering three miles in 13:35.7 and carrying on to 5000 metres in 14:4.2. John Macy, the former Polish international, took second place in 14:24.2m. with the ageing Horace Ashenfelter third in 14:35.6m.

Charley Jenkins won the quarter in 47.4, Rod Ferry captured a hurdles double in 14.2 and 22.9, Don Bragg pole vaulted 14'4" and Ken Bantum put the shot 56'5". Elsewhere in New York, Tom Carroll broke Don Bowden's national schoolboy 880 yards record of 1:52.3 with a time of 1:50.6.

Additional results from the Los Angeles meet of May 24th—in an exhibition women's discus event Mrs. Earlene Brown (156'3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ") upset her Olympic conqueror Mrs. Olgar Fikotova-Carey (150'7").

THE BRITISH GAMES

And Inter-Counties Championships at The White City

A FRESH wind and, on the Monday, a fair amount of rain, did not help performances at the British Games on 8th and 10th June. The weather may also have kept some people away, but I fancy the smaller attendances were due in the main to the lack of "big names" in the international races.

To the real enthusiast, however, the standard of performance was very pleasing. Seldom have we seen better racing in the Inter-County events and performances in the field events were generally excellent, with the javelin standard particularly good.

FIRST DAY

After Crosby had looked all over a winner from his heat and semi-final performances, the 100 yards provided a race seldom seen anywhere, with the first four fighting it out from start to line with little more than a foot between them, all timed 9.9. The positions of Playle and Breacker were reversed after photographs had confirmed Playle as a good fifth.

Ken Norris was not at his best in the 3 miles and George Knight got away on the sixth lap to open up a gradually increasing lead which was 50 yards at the bell. Stan Eldon then went away from Norris, with whom he had run for most of the race, and chased after

Knight, finishing so strongly down the final straight that the result might have been very different had he kept a little closer the leader. One of the best performances here was that of Eddie Strong of Bristol, running for Somerset, who had his first race in January of this year, yet has already shown 14.08 for 3 miles and this time finished fifth in 14:13.2 in front of many well-known and experienced runners. This boy should be amongst the elite before very long.

Harry Kane showed us that he is now back to his best form with a new Championship best of 51.9, and in the long jump Cruttenden continued his recent good work with another best of 23ft. 11ins.

Not to be outdone, Lindsay in the weight and Ellis in the hammer did likewise, Ellis despite finishing with three "no throws." Geoff Elliott showed that his steady return to form continues when taking the pole vault at 13ft. 6ins.

In the international events British athletes were well to the fore. Brian Shenton was well clear entering the straight in the 220 and held on to beat Poerschke (W. Germany) by 2ft. in 22.2.

Hewson was an easy winner of the 880 after Paterson and then Locke had done the pace-making. Hewson "went" with a furlong to go and led by ten yards entering the straight, holding on well to win in 1:49.8. Paterson finished strongly and almost caught Rawson on the line.

Richtzenhain led all the way in the mile until Ibbotson dashed by at the end of the back straight and ran right away from the German. Blagrove showed that he might do even better as a miler when finishing very fast to all but catch Richtzenhain at the finish after being well back with a furlong to go.

After his usual false start, Kinsella was a good winner of the 120 hurdles, with Hildreth just getting the better of Matthews for second place, a good performance by the Poly man after two outings over 440 yards earlier in the afternoon.

The heats of the other events provided few surprises unless it was Woodland's failure to get through his 440 semi-final, or Morris's 48.9 to beat Peter Higgins, though Morris has shown such impressive form recently that it should not have surprised any who have seen him this season.

Injuries could have made a mess of the mile, for not only was Winch a non-starter through aggravating a ligament injury, sustained earlier last week, when running in Saturday's heat, but Mike Berisford was knocked down by a motorcycle on a pedestrian crossing and badly shaken. He ran with his ankle strapped up and it says much for his grit and determination that he won the race quite comfortably. Brian Barrett was a good second but his usual drive over the final lap was missing.

The 6 miles was a great race. After Keily had led for a time Gerry North took over.

He shot out in front and right away to alter the pattern of the race in a single lap. Shaw of Wiltshire looks a promising 'chaser but Shuttleworth should never have let him catch him on the line as he did.

Malcolm caused something of a surprise in the hurdles, though he has won two races against similar opposition in fast time this season. In the high jump Okuwubi just got the better of a close duel with Stableforth in adverse conditions. The javelin produced the best throwing we have seen in this country at one meeting, with Cullen setting a new English Native and British National record. The crowd fully appreciated this competition and were not slow to show their enthusiasm.

Charlie Williams was a comfortable winner of the invitation 100 and Salisbury repeated his victory over Higgins in the 440, though there was little in it this time. In the two miles we saw Olympic silver medalist Richtzenhain hold off Bert Pattison with almost contemptuous ease, though the V.P.H. man and Cooper (M. & D.L.C.) both ran extremely well against known competitors. IDEAL weather conditions favoured the Inter-Varsity Championships at King's College, Aberdeen, and several records were broken.

H. M. Murray, Edinburgh, created a new Scottish Native Record in the H.S.J., which he won with an effort of 47'3 $\frac{1}{2}$ ". In the 120y.H., J. A. T. Johnston, Glasgow beat R. D. McLeod, Aberdeen, the S.A.A.A. Champion, after a terrific tussle in 15.3 which equals the Scottish Native Record and also beats the Inter-Varsity Record. New Inter-Varsity Records were also created in the 440y. and 880y. by J. V. Paterson, Edinburgh, in the times of 48.8 and 1:52.8 respectively. He won the 880y. by 4 yds. from J. A. Boyd, Glasgow, after an exciting race, while in the 440y. he beat R. Cairney, Glasgow, by about 8yds. Boyd, 1:53.6, and Cairney 49.9, both beat the respective Inter-Varsity Records. The other I.V. Records broken were the 1m. won by W. More, Glasgow, in 4:20.8, the 440y.H. won by A. Hannah, Edinburgh, in 54.1, and the H., where R. S. Scott, Glasgow, had a winning throw of 162'11". Edinburgh won the Men's match by 77pts. to Glasgow's 72 after an anti-climax in the 1m. Medley Relay. Level at 72pts. each, the Medley was the deciding event. Over-eagerness by Glasgow led to a faulty change-over and disqualification, leaving Edinburgh comfortable winners.
