

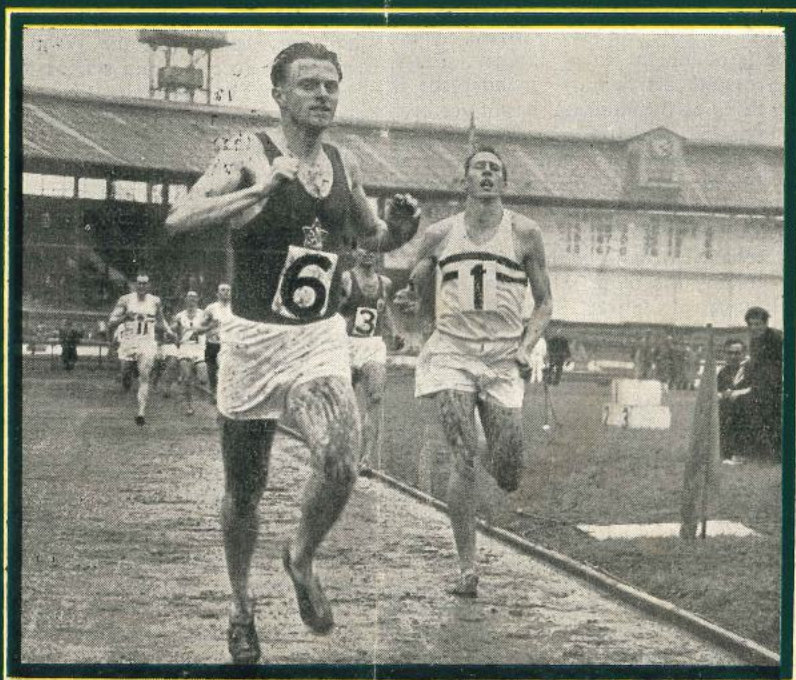

## Race Walking

THE presence of the four Swedish stars lifts this Saturday's 50 kilometres National Championship right out of the rut, if this is the correct term. It is many years since we have had foreign competition on the road and never before have we had Swedish walkers in a road championship. Providing the journey has not had any effect, I think that John Ljunggren will be too good for our men, but the form of 23-year-old Albert Johnson, of Sheffield, at Bradford, on Whit-Monday was really great, and he is bound to put up a show. Frank Bailey, despite his fighting second place in the 20 miles at Birmingham, hasn't yet been too convincing, and his lack of speed early on may give him no chance of getting on terms with the faster of the two Ljunggrens. I see John Ljunggren, the favourite with Johnson, Bailey, Colman, Macfarlane and McGreechan, battling out the issue and just about holding the other three Swedes, Verner, Ljunggren, Ingvar Green and Ake Soderlund. The latter, it will be remembered, was here last autumn and represented Stockholm v. London in a five miles event at White City, when Coleman (G.W.) and Hawkins proved much too fast for him at that distance.

The course at Sheffield I would class as fairly easy. John Proctor's winning time of four years ago was 4.43.04.

I have mentioned Johnson's performance at Bradford, and his time, 4h.36m.36s., if correct, was remarkable, if not sensational, on the hardest course in general use for a distance race. Owing to an aerial display which has made itself a nuisance over the past few years, still another diversion was made this year from the time honoured original course with its three-mile climb out of Otley. This climb was abandoned in favour of a "switch-back" and although, as a competitor myself, I found it even tougher, I am inclined to the view that the course was rather under distance. Charlie Colman (Yorks) held the winner for some way and did well, despite blistered feet, to finish in 4.41.21. He has one of the best styles on

the road to-day and will improve yet. A youngster to note for the future is 19-year-old Wheeler, of Yorkshire, W.C. He was showing some good promise a year ago until an OHMS missive sent him packing. His 4.58.9—eleventh place, shows that the Army has not got him completely down.

The seven miles times at the Inter-Counties Meeting on Whit-Saturday were the slowest for a long time, and the heavy atmosphere was the cause of that. It came out very hot just as the Walk was on the go and before the rain started its long long innings. The two mile times on Monday were good, on the other hand, and my observation that Garry Howell would "shake them up," with a 14.20 was only incorrect as far as the time was concerned. He actually clocked 14:15.4 to get second to Coleman, 14:5.2, and led for three laps, the respective mile times being Coleman 6:52.2, Howell 6.54. I cannot remember the great boy prodigy, A. A. Cooper, seven times AAA 2 miles Champion, putting up times like these at 19 years of age.

Jim Fisher, of Surrey W.C., must have been a happy man on Saturday to find his son, W. J., winning the Surrey Youths Mile in 7.37, a county record. Surrey W.C. made it a good double with R. Dearing winning the Junior.

EVERY SATURDAY — NINEPENCE

THE District Championships this week-end should give us a line on the athletes likely to go to Vancouver, and also some idea of the performances we can expect from them in the Empire Games.

Our team, which is likely to be the largest ever sent, will be selected after the District meetings as entries close before the A.A.A. Championships are held in July.

Only in a few events can we be sure that any particular athlete will be nominated. In some events I do not envy the selectors their task, for even some slight, almost unseen incident could make all the difference between winning and losing, even perhaps failing to gain a place. Though selection will not be made on any single performance, the District events must have a great bearing on the final nominations. In the mile, for instance, we have something like a dozen men capable of inside 4.10. Bannister apart, I would not like to try to sort the remainder into their right order of merit.

It will be touch and go with the sprinters too, for they were beating each other in the Inter-County 100 yards, and it will be difficult to make further comparison between some of them. Box, of Lancashire, for instance. He lost to Down in his heat, beat Lillington to win his semi-final in 9.9, and then finished behind both of them in the final. Down was only third in the semi-final, won in 10 dead by Young, who was last but one in the final. Ellis won the final but was beaten by Young in his semi-final. Who'd be a selector!

Fortunately they won't all be as tough as this. The fast improving Kane has made himself a certainty for the hurdles. Elliott, Pharaoh and Savidge pick themselves. Brian Shenton is another who is almost an automatic selection on current form. Pirie, Sando, Ranger, Ken Norris and Driver can hardly be left out of the longer track events, and the same applies to Johnson and Hewson in the 880, and Hildreth and Parker in the hurdles, though I believe Hildreth may be unable to go. Wilmshurst and Cruttenden seem pretty safe for the triple and long jumps, and Cox is almost sure to be our No. 1 in the high jump. Disley is an obvious steeplechase choice, and Johnson cannot be left out this time. Except for some of the hammer men and walkers, the selection of the remainder is pretty sticky.

Whoever the lucky athletes are, we do know that our team is almost certain to be the strongest ever to represent this country and one which will do itself justice no matter what the opposition is like.

Sodden turf and a flooded track, with still more rain coming down throughout most of the meeting was hardly conducive to good performances, but, on the whole, the track men did really well, none more so than Boyd and Johnson of Oxford, and Haines of Penn for the visitors.

Haines, the U.S.A. national indoor 60m. champion, was in a class of his own and much too good for our sprinters. Derek Johnson took things very easily in the first lap of the 880, allowing Pratt of Cornell to set up a good 15 yards lead which he made no attempt to pull back until the back straight. Then he made his effort, caught his man and won easily going away. Later, Johnson was a comfortable winner of the 440 in 48.9, completing a meritorious double.

The mile was a rather unusual race, even if only for the difference in class between

first and last of the four competitors. Marsden and Boyd led for most of the first lap, run in 60.2, then they gradually went away to pass the 880 mark in 2:03.6. At 2½ laps Boyd left Marsden and was 30 yards in front at the ¾ mile, reached in 3:07.4. Round the last lap Boyd piled on the pace and finished in the fast time of 4:08.8, more than half a lap in front of Brown of Cornell!

In the 3 miles the home pair had just as easy a victory and the greatest enthusiasm from the spectators came when Suddaby forced the pace on the last lap in an obvious endeavour to give the Yanks a quarter of a lap start and lap them before the finish. He succeeded in lapping one and only failed by a yard or so to catch the other; both Farley and Loberg of Cornell finished very tired and very much outclassed.

McAllister Booth had a great race with Chris Higham before winning the 120 hurdles in 15.0 dead. Neither in this, nor the 220 "lows" was the time representative of the performance, for Booth is obviously a class hurdler, something we come to associate with visitors from the States.

Conditions were far more troublesome to the field event men and it was nothing to see a discus thrower slither across the circle with the disc wobbling through the air to land a short distance away, or a high jumper sliding underneath the bar. It says much for Jeffries (high jump), Allison (long jump), Owen (pole vault) and the discus throwers that they managed to perform as well as they did under such conditions. Kretzmar too, was throwing the javelin well on the sodden run-up.

The Americans had the relay won before Haines took over and went further away from Sexton over the last stage. Despite his awkward style, the Penn runner is a fast mover.

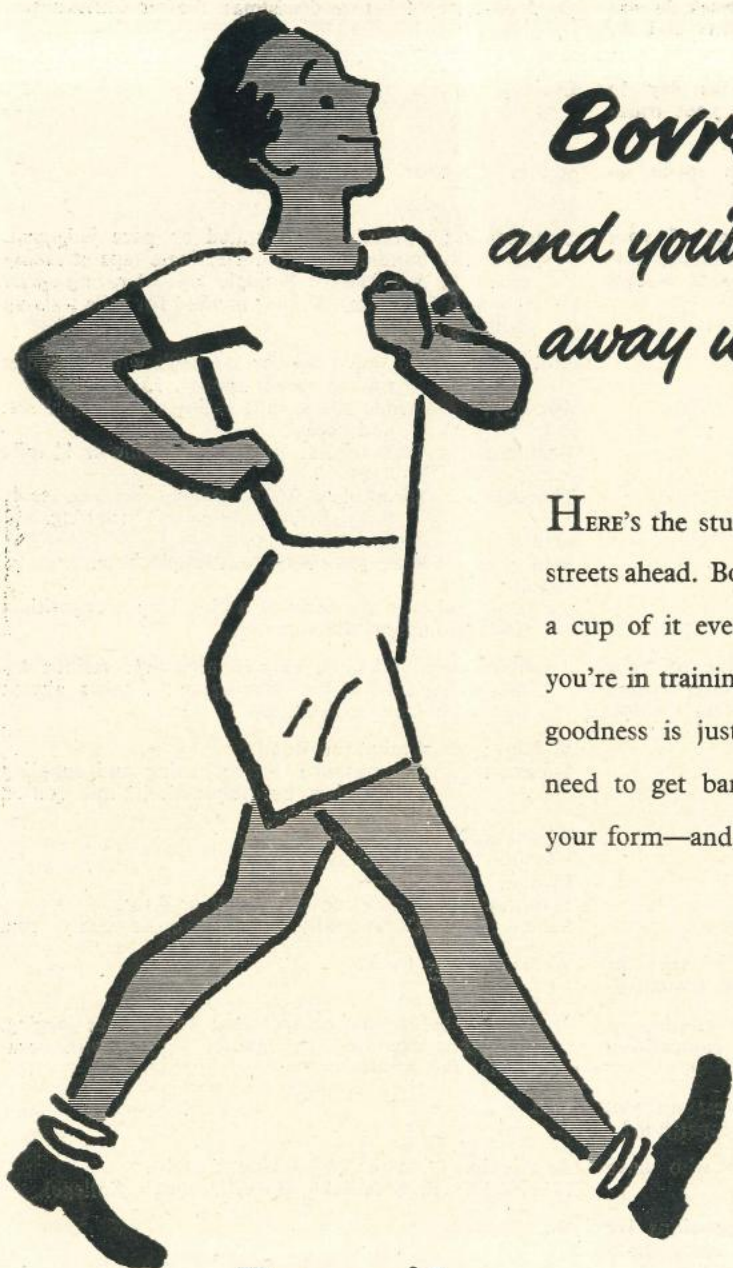

*and some grand running at Glasgow Police Meeting*

Tit-bit of the Glasgow Police meeting watched by 25,000 spectators and some 20 million television viewers, was the 3 miles. Ian Binnie led at a fast pace and had a lead of 50yds. at the mile (4.26) from Eyre. At 2 miles (9.12) he was still a long way out in front. At the bell, Binnie was still a long way in front, but as he weakened so Warren (Australia), followed by Ranger and Eyre, closed the gap and passed him. In the hectic dash for the tape, the small, smooth running Ranger got there first in a new Scottish All-Comers' record of 13:57.0, with Warren and Eyre on his heels, Binnie's time of 14:00.2 was a new Scottish Native record.

## HAREHILLS TO FORE IN PETERBORO' MARATHON

The 6th Annual Marathon at Peterborough on Whit-Monday provided a great triumph for Leeds Harehill Harriers who placed the first two men home and followed up with the fourth to easily take team honours. This Yorkshire Club can field a team of four which will be a major threat to the more fancied Southern Clubs in the forthcoming Polytechnic Marathon.

From what appeared to be a leisurely start, owing to so many competitors being bunched together, E. L. Smith and A. Lawton (Leeds Harehills H.), H. A. Reid (Coventry Godiva H.), A. Etches (Sheffield Un.H.), J. Caswell (Kettering Town H.), and D. Beaumont (Northampton A.C.) settled down to a 5.45 min. per mile pace to gradually draw away from the remainder of the 53 competitors.

At 5 miles Beaumont, who had unwisely forced the earlier pace, had become detached from the leading bunch and Vic Fowle (Herne Hill H.), running strongly ahead of the other Southerners and 150 yards behind the leaders, was closely followed by C. Although weather conditions were variable, and it could not be said that the strong wind was favourable on a three lap circular course, positions of the runners altered little until around the 14 miles point, when Eric Smith refused to allow the pace to

slacken; first Caswell and then Reid began to show signs of distress, whilst Vic Fowle had not lost any ground and was now well ahead of Cockcroft, Coggin and Lucop.

Nearing the 20 miles mark, Eric Smith steadily drew away from his clubmate, Alan Lawton and the improving Etches, who had surprised by his strong running, whilst Cockcroft, inspired by the good news of his team position, surprised himself by coming through strongly to take 4th place in front of Vic Fowle who, with Cockcroft, also enjoyed the satisfaction of achieving a personal best. Eric Smith's time lowered the course record of 2.34.23, held by C. Busby (Blackheath H.).
