# WALKING by A. D. McSweeney

## DON THOMPSON'S SIXTH 50 KILOMETRES TITLE

R.W.A. National 50 Km. Championship,  
Sheffield

WITH a record five wins behind him DON THOMPSON went out from the start at Sheffield to add to that number, and no one could stay with him. His victory looked very certain *before* the start, but he took no chances and hammered away throughout in characteristic fashion, to finish in 4h.22.51s., nearly 7 mins. in front of the second man, Ray Middleton of Belgrave, walking the distance for the first time. Middleton's was the performance of the day. He was back in 14th position at 10km. and 4m.17s. behind Thompson, then moved fast through a bunch to take third at 20km., 4m.55s. behind the leader. Middleton continued to hold Thompson to that 4 minutes odd, after taking second place from Bill Fogg, right up to 10km. to go. Then to the finish Don increased his margin by over 2 minutes.

There was a cloudy sky at the line-up of 70 distance men, but the sun did come out strongly in the closing stages. At 10km. Thompson was 200 yards clear of Bill Fogg who had a bigger margin in hand of Nigel Thompson—striving to take second place to his brother, and Ray Ibbotson of Sheffield. The field was already well strung out. In the next 10km. Fogg, perhaps not too wisely, fought hard to keep Thompson within reach, and the leaders at this stage were: 1, Thompson 1:44.09; 2, C. Fogg 1:45.27; 3, Middleton 1:49.04; 4, N. Thompson 1:49.07; 5, Ibbotson 1:49.12; with a group of four together in 1:50.58.

Back at the Sheffield Wednesday F.C. for halfway the order was the same in the first ten but with Middleton closing rapidly on Fogg. A little further back Thomson of the Met. retired to leave his Club with only three men and out of the race. Times: Thompson D. 2:09.55; Fogg 2:12.13; Middleton 2:14.15; Thompson N. 2:15.38; Ibbotson 2:17.47; Hall R. 2:18.10.

At this stage Brian Kibble, 7th, was leading the Leicester team who were showing up well and were 11 pts. in the lead from Belgrave, Sheffield and Lancashire, but the picture changed rapidly on the second lap, Belgrave gaining fast. Kibble and Ibbotson (Sheffield) dropped places while Charlie Colman brought Lancs. up into the reckoning.

At 40km. (approx. 25 miles) Fogg had been passed by both Middleton and Nigel Thompson while Colin Young and Frank O'Reilly had moved up places. Belgrave's first three Middleton, Ray Hall and George

Beecham, were all going great guns and it all depended upon their fourth. The finish came with Don Thompson 1st, Middleton 2nd, Nigel Thompson 3rd—to equal his performance of 1959, Fogg 4th, Colman 5th and Young 6th, while in the team race, despite a strong effort by Albert Staines to revive Leicester, Belgrave (36) got home by a surprisingly big margin of 19 pts., with Lancashire second, 55; Leicester third, 59; closely followed by Sheffield 60 and Surrey W.C. 61.

The course was a very pleasant and wooded one and the arrangements very well handled by the Sheffield Club. Their one disappointment was that their hopes of clearing the National board this year were doomed on the morning of the race when it became known that Albert Johnson and Lol Allen were non-starters.

**Chigwell 100 Miles Road Walk.** Latest news is that Albert Johnson (Leicester) and Harry Callow (Trowbridge) have successfully resisted efforts to get the race held on their dates and information is given that it will be held on Friday and Saturday, October 20th and 21st.

## NEW STYLE A.A.A. MEETING

**T**HIS year's A.A.A. Championship Meeting, sponsored by The Carborundum Co., Ltd., will not only be a far more spectacular event with two better balanced days of competition, it will also make inevitable a closed Championship meeting in the very near future.

The following standards to be achieved by June 26th show how few U.K. athletes will be able to compete—numbers in brackets show the total entries to be accepted:—

100: 9.9 (36); 220: 21.9 (36); 440: 48.9 (36); 880: 1:52.4 (24); Mile: 4:09 (30); 3M: 13:46 (20); 6M: 29:20 (24); S'chase: 9:20 (20); 120H: 15.1 (20); 220H: 25.3 (18); 440H: 56.0 (18); HJ: 6'3"; PV: 13' 0"; LJ: 23.0"; HSJ: 47'6"; SP: 49'0"; DT: 150'0"; JT: 208'0"; HT: 165'0". Qualifying competitions in H.J. and P.V. only.

So this week-end is the last chance for most athletes to achieve the required standard. The athletes, led by the International Athletes' Club, will be sure to make very strong representations for a closed meeting, for we shall now have no real national championship meeting in which a large number of our best men can compete. In its place we shall have an outstanding annual two-day event which should attract a large crowd and prove financially rewarding. Many of the world's best athletes have been invited; some have already accepted, replies are awaited from the others, but there is no doubt that next month's meeting will be a showpiece of great national and international interest.

Is this phenomenon confined to this area, and is it a natural reaction to the higher and higher standards of performance demanded?

So many young people do not want to be "shown up"; unfortunately the result is fewer and fewer meetings for lack of support by the athletes.

## SIX THROWS ESSENTIAL

Dear Mr. Editor,

I was disappointed to learn from Jean Heath's letter in your issue of June 10th that it is still possible to find an Area Championships meeting in which competitors in a throwing event all had three throws only. It should surely be a matter of pride where the organisers are concerned that a meeting of this calibre is conducted as a first-class meeting should be—which surely implies six throws for the leading competitors, preferably for the best six. Apart from being the correct way in which to conduct the event, it is also fairest to the competitors who (like the officials) have spent a good deal of time and money in order to take part.

Extra throws mean more time, of course. But the programme should be

planned with this in mind, just as it is with carefully spaced heats and finals for track events. Heats ensure that the best competitors fight out the last stages of a track event, and so the extra trials in the throws.

The White City meetings, to give only one example, show how quickly a throwing event can be completed if the calling up of competitors and the measuring are handled efficiently. So, as one who spent yesterday afternoon trying to emulate this example at a local meeting, could I extend this plea to the organisers of meetings at all levels. And to save comrade Hayward of the Kangaroo Club a letter, may I also extend it to the long and triple jumps.

## AGE GROUPS

Dear Sir,

As I was partly responsible for initiating the change in the A.A.A. Rules regarding Age Groups for road races referred to by Mr. W. McGhie (Athletics Weekly, June 10th) perhaps I may be permitted to reply to him. Previously all road running events were classified as "track athletics" which meant that the "track" age groups should have applied. In actual fact most promoters adopted the "cross-country" age groups. This position was not entirely satisfactory and the greatly increased number of road races held throughout the year resulted in a feeling that some tidying up of the rules was necessary. It was possible for an athlete to compete in a Youths' Road Race one week and in a Boys' race at a later date simply because promoters adopted different rules. Events were also held in September, taking the effective date for deciding age groups as the 1st of the previous October, which meant that some competitors

could be almost 12 months over age on the day of the competition, something which was never originally envisaged.

The object of the new rules is to make it clear that for road races held during the cross-country season the cross-country age group shall apply and for those held during the rest of the year the track age groups apply. Thus no competitor should be more than about six months over age on the day of the competition and a team will not be broken up during a season through members reaching a higher age group.

One expects a little commonsense to be applied when such a change takes place and although certain events mentioned by Mr. McGhie may have been held after the new rules were issued it must be obvious that the conditions for these events must have been advertised beforehand and probably the entries would have been made before the change became known.

Whatever dates are adopted in determining age groups there will always be some unlucky individual who was born a day too soon or a day too late, and the fact that one or two may be particularly unlucky and have only one opportunity to run in one race is surely not sufficient justification for condemning an attempt to overcome a rather unsatisfactory position.

## A COMPARISON

Dear Sir.

I have just received the A.W. dated June 10th and as a former West Country athlete was sorry to read your editorial about the cancellation of the South-Western A.A.A. Championships, due to insufficient entries. You call it "a poor show" but to anyone who knows something about the appalling lack of facilities for athletes in this part of the world, it is very understandable. Scholars cannot be produced without schools, so how can athletes be produced without tracks provided with the necessary equipment? To succeed in such conditions an athlete must be possessed of an almost super-human determination, as is Brian Kent-Smith who has to train on the unsatisfactory surface of a road. Ordinary mortals soon lose the enthusiasm they may have acquired at school.

During the time that I have been living out here I have been surprised to find out how much more advanced, in this respect, than my own country, is such a comparatively minor athletic power as Switzerland. In this not very heavily populated agricultural canton of Vand I am astonished every time I go to run at a meeting in a country town to find always a well prepared cinder track. What a contrast they are with the undulating cross-country courses which are called tracks in my own home country!

# TONY TOWL SMASHES WALTON "15" RECORD

TONY TOWL, that little stylish fellow from Herne Hill, came out for the Walton "15" on 17th June in one of his most aggressive moods—he gets them frequently now. Tony's pleasure is front running and he lapped the Walton track four times to record the first mile in 4.50; he had Rob Roath for company, but once out on the road on a three-lap course Bob was shaken off and Tony covered his first 5 miles in 26.05. Continuing this singular story Tony increased his lead of 65 secs. at 5 miles to 2.50 at 10 miles (51.40) and maintained a remarkably even pace for each 5 miles—26.05, 25.35, 25.34—in keeping with his tiny vital statistics. It was obviously record running from the start and this magnificent effort simply pulverised, by 3.20, the course record of 1:20.34 set up by Bob Roath in 1959. There is not enough space to give Tony's performance the praise it deserves.

Bob Roath gallantly defended the attack on his record but the Walton star needs more mileage to balance a long lay-off due to injury and tendon trouble. At 8 miles up came "Dinky" Pawsey to take over second place from Bob and at 10 miles (54.30) they were only 20 yards apart, the one minute at the finish tells the rest of the story. The fortunes of the immediate followers worked out like this: at 5 miles Allen (27.40) was running strongly ahead of Harrison (28.05) who was just 10 seconds in front of Richardson, Gobey, Winchester and Hicks. Darchambaud (29.10) was bringing along a surprise S.L.H. team. The order at 10 miles was little changed, Allen (55.15) held on to 4th place and Harrison (55.40) was being hard pressed by the Walton pals—Richardson and Winchester (55.50). Young Ron Gobey had a bout of sickness and was forced to stop but walked past the 10th mile at 56.50; he was looking for comfort, I believe, but got the whip!

Amongst the usual crowd of "hangers-on," who consistently menace the leaders—you know, the Minchingtons, Dellars, Dennis's, Hentys and Sawyers—it was refreshing to welcome a team from S.L.H. taking a hand in the destination of such an excellent array of prizes.

# WILKINSON WINS LEEDS-BRADFORD ROAD RACE

June 3rd

THE Leeds-Bradford Road Race, sponsored by the Milk Marketing Board, began in a warm, humid atmosphere from Beckett's Park, Leeds, and almost immediately the class men sorted themselves out from the 47 starters.

By the time the Keighley Road roundabout was reached Peter Wilkinson was 40 yards in front of Dennis (Burn Road), with Clayton, Matley, Plews and Pawson following in that order.

"Wilkie" zoomed over the Leeds-Bradford border (approx. 7 miles) in 36.26 to take the special award. Further behind Pawson was being caught by Wragg, Carmichael, Ramage and Birkinshaw. On the pull up from Greengates, Wilkinson drew steadily away but Dennis—the surprise packet of the race—looked full of beans and holding second place comfortably. Wragg was dropping back but team-mate Hill was running strongly and put the team result beyond all doubt.

And so to the finish where Peter Wilkinson, aided wonderfully by the Bradford City Police in crowded Westgate, was received with open arms by the charming Dairy Queens of Leeds and Bradford, and as many "pintas" as he cared to quaff. Dennis fol-

lowed 40 sec. later and Matley just got the better of Harry Clayton for third place. The wonderful hospitality of the Express Dairy, Bradford, set the seal on a splendid race.

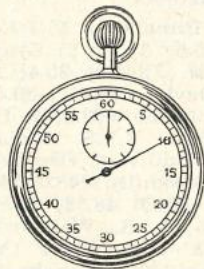

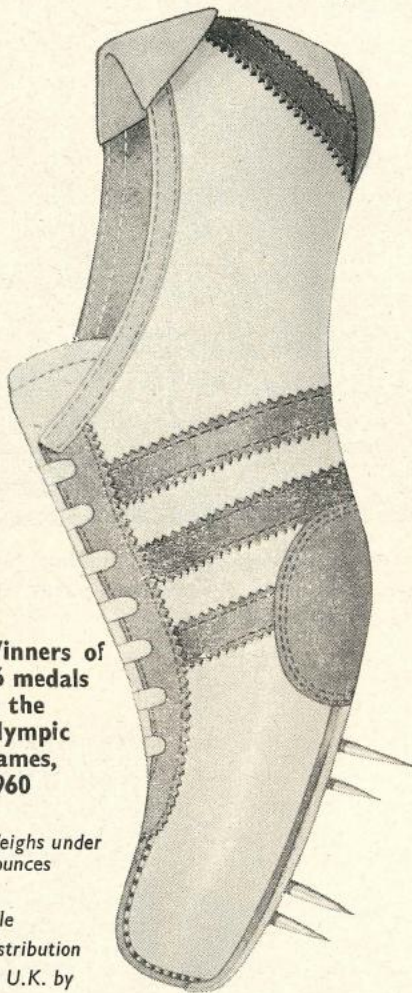

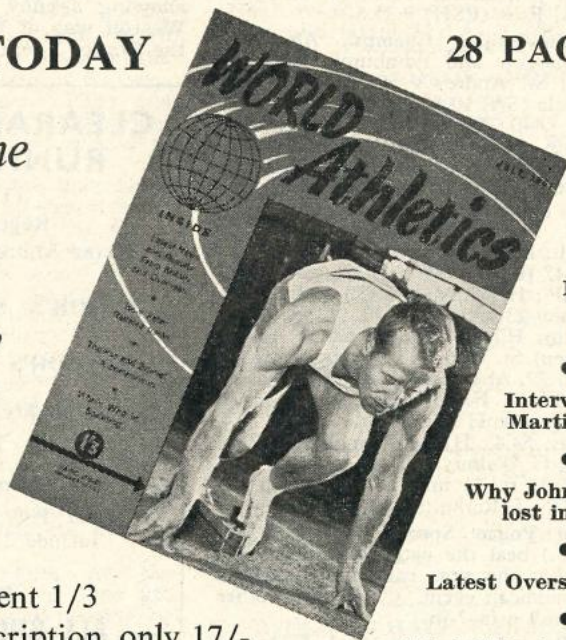

# Overseas News

By MELVYN WATMAN

## FRANK BUDD DOES IT AGAIN

AT the risk of boring readers, I must report that, yet again, the 100 yards world record has been equalled. Frank Budd, 21-year-old U.S. Olympian, ran his second 9.3 of the year at Villanova, Pa., on June 11th. He clocked 20.3 for 220 (straight) the same day.

That even more prolific 9.3 performer, Dennis Johnson, pulled a muscle the previous day in a 220 race at Stanford. It could be serious enough to sideline him for the rest of the season. Earlier, he had won the 100 in 9.4. At this meet Santa Clara Youth Village set a U.S. 4 x Mile relay record of 16:26.5, only 1.3 sec. outside Hungary's world mark.

Remarkable performances were put up by two juniors at Compton on June 2nd. Bruce Kidd, the 17-year-old Canadian who is already U.S. indoor 3 miles champion, clocked a sizzling time of 13:26.6 for 3 miles en route to a 13:56.4 5,000 metres. Tom Sullivan (18) ran a 4:03.5 mile. Herb Elliott lost two world junior bests in the process; the mile by a margin of 0.8 sec., the 3 miles by all of 35.8 sec.! Kidd was followed home by Max Truex (13:31.4 and 14:03.4), while Sullivan finished second to Jim Grelle's 4:02.7.

Other highlights at Compton included a 9.5/20.9 (turn) sprint double by Frank Budd, a 46.3 quarter by Earl Young, the year's fastest half of 1:48.2 by Ernie Cunliffe; a 13.7 high hurdles by Hayes Jones, a win for Dallas Long (62'3 $\frac{3}{4}$ "") over Parry O'Brien (61'7 $\frac{1}{2}$ ""), a 194'4 $\frac{1}{2}$ " throw by Rink Babka ahead of Jay Silvester's 194'1 $\frac{1}{2}$ " (who narrowly fouled 198'0 $\frac{1}{2}$ ""), and a 221'1" hammer toss by Hal Connolly, who now uses four turns. John Thomas beat Bob Avant on the count-back at 6'10"; while an all-star pole vault was won at an "ordinary" 15'4" by Ron Morris, with Jim Brewer and John Cramer tying for 2nd at 15'0 $\frac{3}{4}$ " and record-holders present and past George Davies and Don Bragg equal 4th also at 15'0 $\frac{3}{4}$ ".

Overshadowing performances at the Houston Meet of Champions on June 9th was a strike against segregated seating by the 20 Negro competitors, who included Ralph Boston, John Thomas, Hayes Jones, George Kerr and Stone Johnson. One of the stars of the depleted meet was Britain's Mike Wiggs, who set a U.S. freshman

record of 4:04.8 in winning the mile. He and his Southern Illinois colleagues Brian Turner and Bill Cornell have posted several promising marks since they were belatedly given permission to race by the BAAB: Wiggs, 1:52.2 880 and 4:03.5 mile relay leg; Cornell, 1:51.9 and 4:14.6; Turner, 1:53.9 and 4:05.9 relay legs, 9:01.3 2 miles and 13:58.9 3 miles. A somewhat older "frosch," Fred Norris, turned in a 14:02 3 miles at Houston.

Olympic 400m champion, Otis Davis, is rounding into sub-45 sec. form again. He clocked 20.9 for a curved 220 on May 18th and set a U.S. 300 metres record of 32.7 on June 3rd. Another Rome victor, Al Oerter, threw the discus 187'6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " on June 10th and is out to beat Messrs. Babka, Silvester, Piatkowski and Szecsenyi to the 200-foot mark.

At one meet (June 2nd/3rd), Ralph Boston won four events: 120yH (13.7), 220yHt (23.2), LJ (25'6 $\frac{1}{2}$ "") and HSJ (48'10 $\frac{3}{4}$ "")—and tied for second with a 6'7" high jump. Dallas Long produced a personal best shot putt of 64'7 $\frac{3}{4}$ " on June 9th. His astonishing series: 63'8 $\frac{3}{4}$ "", 62'0" ; 64'7 $\frac{3}{4}$ "", 61'6 $\frac{1}{4}$ "", 64'1", 64'4 $\frac{1}{2}$ "".
