NEWS FROM CANADA

A MOST interesting letter from Geoff Dyson who is busy preparing for Canada's second National Track and Field Coaches' Course in August, arrived this last week and gave an insight into life in that country.

Living some 2½ miles from the centre of Ottawa, the Dyson family have settled down and are greatly impressed by the politeness, kindness and hospitality of Canadians. They think it a great country. Geoff has already run "clinics" at Vancouver Island, Winnipeg and Fredricton, and has made many T.V. and Radio appearances. The National Coaches' Course will be the highlight of the year and Jim Alford, Lionel Pugh, Geoff Elliott, John Disley and John Savidge will be assisting Geoff on the Course. The performances of Kidd, Crothers and Steen are helping to stimulate enthusiasm, which is growing steadily all the time.

Our own Coaches' Association are holding their A.G.M. at 5.30 p.m. on July 13th, immediately after the A.A.A. Championships, at The Springbok, South Africa Road, London, W.12. Membership is nearing the 100 mark and is increasing steadily. A new secretary will have to be elected as Don Evans has found personal and business commitments increasing to such an extent that he will be unable to carry on. Coaches interested in joining the A.C.A. will be welcome at The Springbok on July 13th.

Reader John Page writes this week to praise his own Bank's Sports Day, the most successful for many years, due largely to "a minimum number of officials who

worked extremely hard and kept events continuing smoothly and efficiently, the use of four walkie-talkie sets, and an informative announcer in Specialist Club's secretary Ron Murray". Mr. Page feels that given these features, plus an aggressive attitude from the competitors themselves, even a White City Meeting could be run to

time and the crowd satisfied.

I would mention, too, that some of the best organised meetings I have seen are some of the more important Schools' meetings, but both Bank and School meetings are very different in many aspects to a major meeting at the White City, where the spectators expect so much and competitors are more temperamental and need more

tactful handling.

We have included all the area championships of last weekend in this issue, also the Scottish meeting, but though holding space until the last moment, the Welsh had not arrived when we went to press and will have to be included next week. I regret, too, that only the winner's times have been given in the Midland Women's Championships, but these were all the details available. It seems incredible in this day and age that winners' performances only should be considered necessary, even where the winner put up a new best performance, but there it is. One is left completely in the dark, if place performances are not given, as to whether the second athlete was breathing down the neck of the winner or beaten by the proverbial street.

MILING OUTLOOK

Dear Sir.

At the Compton Meet, U.S.A., recently, Peter Snell ran 3:55.0 for the mile, followed by five Americans, all inside 4 mins. and averaging about 3:57.0. At our recent Inter-County mile, won in 4:05.0, the winner, Alan Simpson, said words to the effect that the time was too fast for so early in the season.

I'm not belittling anyone who can do 4:05 for the mile, but surely these two races show the difference in outlook between the top world milers and our own competitors. Snell, Beatty, Burleson and Co. obviously have different ideas as to what a "fast" mile is, and it is about

time we changed our ideas too.

Thinking in terms of the world record of 3:54.4, 4:05 can hardly rank as "fast". I think we've become mesmerised by the 4 min. mile barrier and our efforts are concentrated on that mark rather than on the world record which is $5\frac{1}{2}$ sec. faster. Obviously, to runners such as Snell, Jazy and Beatty, 4 minutes is incidental to breaking the world record, if possible, and if we are to regain our position as a leading middle distance country, we must start thinking in such terms too.

To reach the final of the 1,500 metres at Tokyo, I should think one will have to able to do 3:37/38 and, surely, if our milers are not doing comparable times by then, they cannot be expected to have the confidence to do

well in the Olympics. Let's think "big" for a change and regain some prestige. John Boulter is setting a good example, so let us hope others follow it and regard 4 mins. just as a fast, and not the ultimate aim.

He has recently set a new Czech Junior record for 5,000 metres on the Prague track with a time of 21m. 21.6 secs. and he won a 19.3km road walk in Prague by nearly 3 mins. in 1hr. 30m. 42s. 

Comeback by Bill Nieder?

MISS track. The first year out I didn't care much. But last year, and this, I really miss it. It's all I think about."

The speaker: Bill Nieder, Olympic shot-put champion and former record holder at 65' 10"/20.07. Now aged 29, Nieder is keeping his fingers crossed that he will be allowed back into the sport from which he exiled himself nearly three years ago by becoming a professional boxer.

In December the National A.A.U. will consider Nieder's application for reinstatement. The chances are good as Nieder claims that, far from profiting by his venture into the ring, it cost him over £1,000. However, if successful he still would not be eligible for international competition, I.A.A.F. rules being more stringent than those of the A.A.U.

Nieder, who took up boxing partly because a knee injury threatened to end his athletic career, has evolved a new putting technique.

off-beat track notes

He told our colleagues at Track & Field News: "It isn't as much of a strain on my right knee, and I think it's more efficient. Instead of starting on the right leg as O'Brien does, I start on my left. I still face the back of the ring, but I take a quick little step in the middle of the ring to start myself into throwing position. This is quicker, and imparts more rotation. I figure it's about 30% faster than O'Brien's form. It's easier to learn, too, and beginners should catch on more quickly."

Big Bill reckons that by December he should be as good as ever. When he began training again he couldn't even hit 50 ft. (15.24), but after only three weeks he was up around 59 ft. (17.98).

McKenley the post-war tops

CCORDING to a statistical survey by Roger Gynn, the greatest shot-putter of the postwar era was neither Nieder nor O'Brien, but Jim Fuchs. He is the man with the highest percentage after comparing the average of each athlete's best six marks with the average of the world record at the end of each year in which the performances were made. In his case, 58'68"/17.84 against the world record "average" of 58'9½"/17.92, or 99.55%.

The top twelve under this system are: Herb McKenley (400m) 100%, Ray Norton (200mt) 99.75%, Emil Zatopek (10,000m) 99.73%, Lloyd La Beach (100m) and Valeriy Brumel (HJ)



99.7% each, Zdzislaw Krzyszkowiak (3,000m ST) 99.66%, Andy Stanfield (200mt) 99.65%, Tom Courtney (800m) 99.6%, Glenn Davis (400mH) 99.59%, Vladimir Kuts (5,000m) 99.58%, George Rhoden (400m) 99.56%, Jim Fuchs (SP) 99.55%.

This man Shinnick

PHILLIP KENT SHINNICK, who with one wind-assisted jump of 27'4"/8.33 last month leapt, figuratively speaking, from rags to riches, never jumps in training and his only weight training consists of a little isometric work. Fartlek, wind sprints and distance running make up the bulk of his autumn and winter training, and during the season he does repetition sprints and run-up practice.

A blond, blue-eyed economics student at University of Washington (State), Shinnick is 20, 6'3"/1.90 tall, weight 180lb/82kg. He began as a high jumper when he was 12 (he cleared 6'4"/1.93 last year) and took up long jumping three years later. His progress until this year was anything but spectacular: 19'9"/6.02 in 1958, 20'0"/6.10 in 1959, 22'9½"/6.95 in 1960, 23'3½"/7.11 in 1961, 23'2"/7.06 in 1962. His legitimate best this year is 25'5"/7.75 though.

from behind the board, he has been measured at 26'10\frac{1}{2}"/8.19. His target is 27'10"/8.48, but Ralph Boston believes his young rival will jump over 28 ft. (8.53) when he has gained in strength, experience and confidence.

STILL on the subject of long jumping, there appears to be a quiet revolution taking place in the States. A reader of Track & Field News has complained to that magazine about the use of the term long jump-"which can only be regarded as a British affectation". The editor jumped gallantly to the defence. "Not an affectation," he pointed out, "long jump is a far more accurate term and is used in English, or is translated to an equivalent, almost everywhere else in the world. Southern California track leaders want to substitute long jump for broad jump."

One notices the reverse trend here in Britain. One national athletics magazine often refers to broad jump, while in the Oxford & Cambridge v. Harvard & Yale programme the event was listed as long jump or broad jump. Still, at least long jump is safe from the "daffy track definitions" of Bob Robinson, which first appeared in The Oregonian. Here are some

examples:-

Sprinter: Trackman who lacks endurance. Distance runner: Trackman who lacks speed. Middle distance runner: Trackman who lacks

both speed and endurance.

Warming up: Drinking a cup of coffee under

the grandstand between events.

Stretch (Home straight): Portion of track running in front of main grandstand where runners try to look as casual and fresh as possible.

Backstretch: Portion of track opposite the main grandstand where runners expectorate, groan, and in various other ways relieve their

misery.

Kick: Point near end of race at which the runner clenches his fists, tightens his muscles, contorts his face and, occasionally, increases his speed slightly.

Decathlon: Track's answer to military basic training.

Steeplechase: Race for slow hurdlers and good swimmers.

And, of course-

Broad jump: Women's field event.

Macquet Retires



NE of the world's foremost javelin throwers. Michel Macquet, of France, has been forced to retire from competition. A specialist told him that if he continued throwing he might lose the use of his right arm.

The resurgence of French athletics in recent years is due in no small measure to Macquet's example both as an athlete and, since 1960, captain of the national team. Though in major championships he never placed higher than 4th (1958 European) his record in international matches was a brilliant one. During 1960 and 1961 he suffered only one defeat of consequence—unfortunately at the Olympics, where he failed to qualify.

Now aged 31, Macquet won his first French title back in 1953 and between 1954 and 1961 he carried the national record from 211'114"/ 64.60 to 273'6"/83.36 (currently 13th on the world all-time list). Ed. Lacey's photo shows Macquet winning the 1961 A.A.A. title.

BOOK REVIEW

International Athletics Annual—1963; compiled by the Association of Track and Statisticians (General Editor: Roberto Quercetani) and published by "World Sports" at 7s. 6d.

It's the mixture as before, which will satisfy the track nuts to whom this annual collection of facts and figures is directed. In addition, Dr. Quercetani has contributed an article that will appeal especially to the historically minded in which he selects the three best athletes of each decade of this century. Of the 18 athletes nominated, one is British. Who? Well finding out is just one of the many reasons for buying this remarkably comprehensive yet inexpensive publication.

CZECHOSLOVAKIA: DANEK FLINGS DISCUS 60 METRES

Karel Merta's Czech and former European discus record of 186'0"/56.69 (set in Manchester!) was beaten by 26-year-old Ludvik Danek (6'3½"/1.92, 220lb/100kg), whose best last year was 185'8"/56.59. Only seven men in the world have ever thrown farther than Danek's 196'11\(\frac{1}{4}\)"/60.04. He beat Zemba (182'9"/55.70) and Nemec (181'3\(\frac{1}{4}\)"/55.26). 

Jackson 47.4 at Midland Championships

BARRY JACKSON and Ken Matthews pionships, staged at Smethwick on June 22nd. Jackson made light work of both the buffeting wind and a formidable opponent in Ron Taylor to take the quarter in 47.4, best time by a British athlete this season. Jackson was very pleased with his performance: "I wanted the confidence of a fast quarter behind me so that when I next tackle the half-mile I know that if I pass the quarter in 50 or 51 I'm running well within myself." Boulter, look out!

The 440y was expected to be a three-cornered fight, but the third man-Malcolm Yardley did not even make the final. He ran only 52.0 in his heat. "I just couldn't do anything about " said Yardley, who ran 51.4 at the age of 15. He runs 400m in Berlin tomorrow (Sunday).

Matthews walked immaculately as usual, passing the mile post in 6:37.6 and finishing in 13:27.0 to knock 9 seconds off his 1960

championship record.

Both Roy Fowler and Brian Kilby had reason to feel happy with their showing in the 3 miles. After a very slow start, with Bill Adcocks leading (2:23.4 880y, 4:41.2 mile), Kilby pepped up the pace from the 5th lap onwards. He passed 2M in 9:15.0 and led until Fowler frisked past 250y from home. Fowler won by a stride in 13:45.2, a plucky run by a man who had been suffering from acute shin soreness all week. Kilby sliced 5.6 sec. off his personal best with a magnificent 13:45.6, having covered the last 2 miles in around 9:04. Basil Heatley ran rather indifferently in 3rd place.

Peter Beacham, a junior, took the field around a 54.0 first lap in the half and did well to finish in 1:52.7 some 8y behind an impressive Neill Duggan, who could well run 3:43 or better over 1,500m in Berlin, John Morbey scored a fine double in the 100y and long jump, both times against the wind. With Alan Carter right off form, the standard in the throwing events was deplorable. A 49-year-old discus thrower - Konstanty Maksimczyk ought not to be winning an area title.

DRAMATIC 3 MILES IN SOUTHERN CHAMPIONSHIPS

Bob Sparks from Welwyn Garden City, June 22nd

THERE can have been few more dramatic or unexpected results than that of the 3 miles, in which Bruce Tulloh had his first important race of the year. Most of the pacing was undertaken by Mel Batty, helped briefly in the last mile by Tulloh, and at the bell these two led by a good 20 yards from Hyman, with Don Taylor apparently spent about 10 yards further back. Interest was centered mainly on which of the two leaders would make the first break, although it was clear that Taylor was closing on Hyman round the penultimate bend; as Tulloh and Batty continued to wait for each other, the gap behind them started to shrink, and it was now that Taylor saw his chance. With less than 200 yards left, Tulloh burst away, but by now Taylor was gaining rapidly. Tearing past Batty on the bend, the bearded Y.M.C.A. leader closed on Tulloh with surprising ease, and the astonished European Champion could find no answer in time as he was caught and passed in the final few yards.

Apart from this king-sized sensation, which produced as by-products the fastest time of the year in Britain, plus Tulloh's first defeat by a home athlete since 1961, there was little to marvel at on the track. The blustery conditions did not help matters, but there seems to be a general lifelessness about our middle-distance running which was typified by a mile in which a first lap of 58.9 could produce nothing better than 4m. 6.7s. at the end. George Howard's run-away win and personal best in the steeple-chase gave perhaps the greatest satisfaction, although it was pleasing to see Mike Fleet's consistency at last rewarded with his first major title; Tim Graham's rapid improvement in his first year of half-miling promises a most respectable future.

In the field, it was good to see the return of the wandering weightmen, Martyn Lucking and Mike Lindsay, both seeming larger than ever. With Hollingsworth absent, Mike had an easy passage in the discus; his series was 168'5"/ 162'2"/163'8½"/166'9"/169'9"/167'6" and cluded two throws over his previous best for the year. Moving to the shot circle, Mike started with 57'2" and continued with 57'04"/ $-\frac{56'0''}{56'3\frac{1}{2}''}$ 56'1"; Dr. Lucking, immense in voice but otherwise somewhat rusty, began with 56'2" but managed only 54'03" after that. Both were competing for the first time in three months, and Mike Lindsay's double, first class by any standards, was indeed an encouraging start; the last time he won these titles was as a junior in 1957!

It may seem odd to mention any U.K. record last of all, but frankly one can find only faint praise for a performance that is still 2½ feet behind the world record. Nevertheless, all congratulations to Rex Porter for his tenacity in removing at last Geoff Elliott's dust-laden mark from the shelf. Perhaps of greater interest on reflection was Porter's display of panache in

FINE "3" BY ANDERSON IN NORTHERN CHAMPS.

THE sun shone on the Northern Counties Championships at Blackburn on June 22nd but a blustery wind which persisted through-out the afternoon bothered the officials, drew the sap out of most of the middle-distance men and enhanced the sprinting. It is true to say that, but for the wind, the overall standard of these championships would have been much higher.

The meeting got off to a discouraging start in front of a sparse crowd when the electrical apparatus refused to function, and the low number of entries in the 440 yards hurdles caused the event to be run as a straight final. Happily, the former defect was remedied, the spectators became more numerous as the day wore on, and we saw some fine sport.

All the sprints were wind-aided, but some excellent results were seen here. This applied particularly to the 220y in which Alf Meakin, having won the 100y earlier, and although producing what was probably the best furlong of his career-wind or no wind-found himself pipped at the post by David Edwards; a first-year senior who appears to possess immense potential.

The success of local runner Mike Airey in the 440y final went down well with the crowd and was a well-deserved victory. Airey, who has improved his personal best twice within a week, is reaping the benefit of some very hard work and at the age of 27-having once retired from the sport!—is a shining example to his juniors.

The half-mile provided a talking-point when George Ellis, third in the 1954 European 200m, ran away from Bob Piercy and Andy Green in the final stages. Not bad for someone who will be 31 in September.

The 3 miles was won by John Anderson, the holder, with great authority and by means of a crushing final three laps in 3:13.8. Brian Craig, M. Deakin, Mike Bullivant and Gerry North all had their share of the pace-making but when a very relaxed-looking Anderson took the lead at the end of the ninth lap, the sudden increased tempo was too much for his rivals.

Arthur McKenzie captured the only "double" of the day, in the shot and discus, just missing
