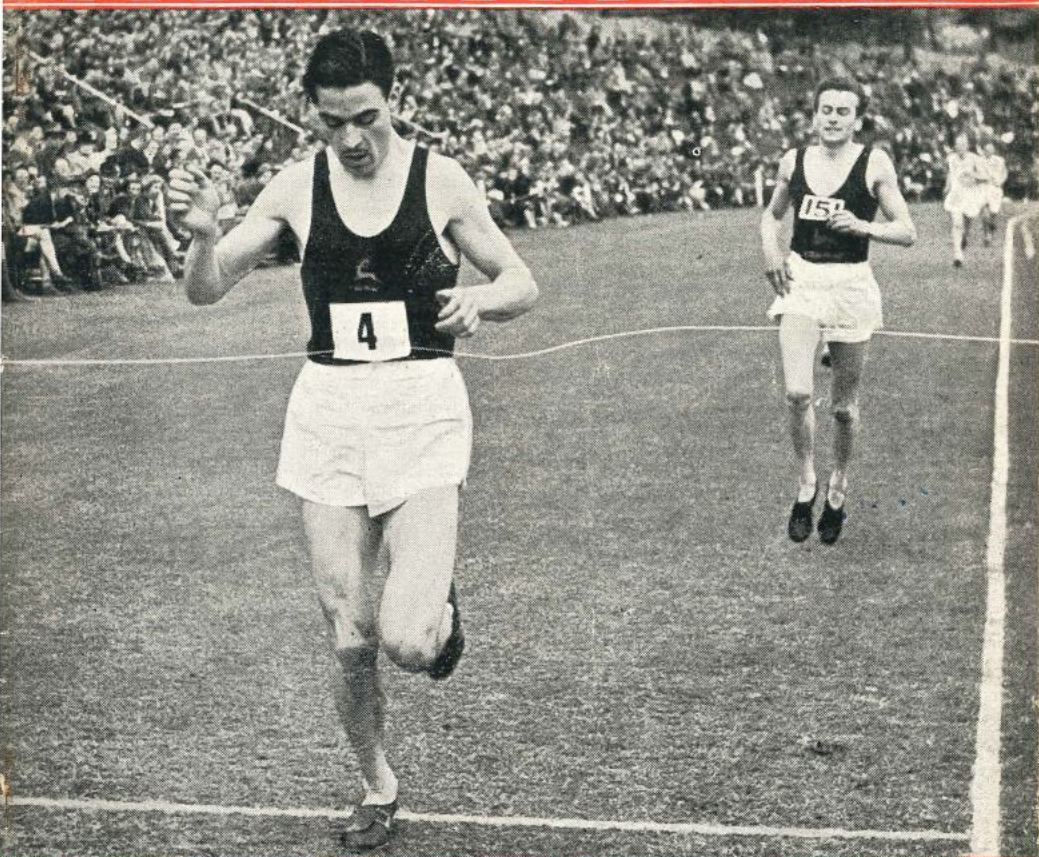

**T**HE Best British Performances list published this week shows a further rise in the standard of athletics in Britain. Except for the javelin, the standard generally is higher than a year ago, with more athletes showing performances of international calibre.

If further proof is needed, Jack Crump's report of the Jubilee meeting in Amsterdam last Sunday is some guide. Our hosts on this occasion may not have been up to the highest international standard but our lads practically swept the board.

In the one to three miles events we are particularly strong, with many newcomers showing most encouraging form. Jack Crump must find it a headache to give all those deserving of official recognition as many engagements as he would like. Fortunately, perhaps, there seem to be more international meetings this year to which our athletes are usually invited. The clubs may dislike these invitations at times but prospective Olympic and international athletes must have experience of such competition.

## ROYAL NETHERLANDS JUBILEE MEETING, Amsterdam, June 3

**B**BRITISH athletes are getting tough and confident. Unworried by the hard racing most of them had undergone on the previous day, they travelled over very early Sunday to Amsterdam and very nearly swept the board.

Only in the hurdles in which P. B. Hildreth struck the first obstacle and was beaten by an inch or two in 15.1 secs. did the British male athletes fail to win the events in which they competed, and our two women representatives were superior to all but the incomparable Fanny Blankers-Koen, who is as good as ever in my view. ## Race Walking

by F. W. Blackmore

**I**N a little more than a year, at Helsinki, there will again be Olympic walking championships on road and track.

Whilst it is certain these events will incur the strong disapproval of those who would "disqualify" International Walking once and for all—and certainly they have spared no efforts to this end, justly unsuccessfully, since the European championships of 1950—even those who have the best interests of the sport at heart cannot contemplate them without some degree of apprehension.

Certain factors, of course, are beyond the influence of those who would wish to ensure the satisfactory carrying-out of the walking events, since they are subject to agreement among the International representatives who sit on the Walking Commission of the I.A.A.F. And even though there might be unanimity among this small body, inspired by wisdom, tolerance, and above all a full sense of judgment and justice for every individual competitor, danger to the safe and satisfactory conclusion of the events must still remain in the human elements of courage or weakness, of too impulsive or too dilatory decision as displayed by the judges. It is difficult indeed to guarantee that a body of men representing different nations, will interpret and operate the rules with precisely the same degree of accuracy and prompt decision. However, as we have cause to realise with the world in its present state, this same difficulty extends into

far more important realms of International affairs.

Whilst some of us will have the opportunity to strive at least for the best, let all the rest of walking enthusiasts hope devoutly that next year's Olympic walks will set a new standard in the history of these events, putting an end once and for all to the antagonism of those who, though they have no real knowledge of the sport, find tinder for their fire in various "incidents." Above all, as far as this country is concerned, let us hope we may be represented by walkers whose mode of progression will be beyond the challenge of the most biased and partisan view, and whose ultimate supremacy will be equally emphatic.

The Olympic 50 kilometres will take place on Monday, 21st July, starting at 1 p.m., over a course which in parts, for short distances, will prove a test of stamina on the outward journey, and a test of control on the return. The heats of the 10,000 metres track walk are scheduled for 11 a.m. on the morning of Thursday, 24th July, with the final at 5 p.m. on Sunday, 27th July.

No doubt these dates and times will be registered in the minds of all those interested in the first serious trial to find our likely representatives, i.e. the Southern Area Invitation 19,000 metres 12-a side match North v. South of the Thames, due to be decided at 6.30 p.m. at the White City on Wednesday next, 13th June, by courtesy and invitation of the London Athletic Club.

# ATHLETIC CLUBS OF BRITAIN

By JAMES AUDSLEY



## SUTTON HARRIERS

**I**N the appalling conditions of the 1947 "freeze-up," Sutton Harriers journeyed from St. Helens to Apsley and there won the National Cross-Country Championship. It was a remarkable performance, for the club really had only the bare six needed to score, though they actually started eight. The scorers were A. Tyrer, F. McMinnis, T. Fillingham, J. Harrison, W. McMinnis and E. Henderson the other couple being E. McMinnis, who had influenza, and M. Maleedy, who was only 18. Since then Sutton's National record of second in 1948 and first again in 1949, 1950 and 1951 has proved conclusively that the 1947 effort was no fluke and virtually every discussion of cross-country running has been a discussion of Sutton Harriers.

Though it was the 1947 win that put Sutton "on the map," the Harriers are no newcomers to the athletic scene, and 1947 was not their first National triumph. The club was founded in 1899 and was soon in the honours, winning the National in 1906, when C. Straw won the individual championship and went on to finish first in the international. A year later, Sutton went to Paris to defeat the French champions, Stade Francais.

A scoring member at that time was J. Morris, who was to do much for the

club and become something of a "maid of all work." Unfortunately, Morris died during the second world war and did not see Sutton's second National success. When the club was revived after the war, his son, M. Morris, was elected Chairman.

Revival was necessary, for the war cost the Harriers their headquarters and they had to close down: but it was a steady rather than a spectacular process. It started with three runners; and when the total reached seven seniors and four juniors, Sutton felt that they were ready to try for the highest honours. Results showed that they were, too. If the quantity was exceptionally small, the quality was—well, exceptional; and the most striking feature about the club recently has been, not just its extraordinary record, but that that record has been achieved with little more than the minimum membership needed to start teams. When Sutton started nine in the 1951 National, they did so for the first time. Four scoring members of the 1947 team, the McMinnis brothers, Harrison and Fillingham, have counted in every race since.

J. Forshaw, a former secretary, and T. Fillingham were largely responsible for the revival, Forshaw becoming treasurer, Fillingham assistant secretary, H. Wilson

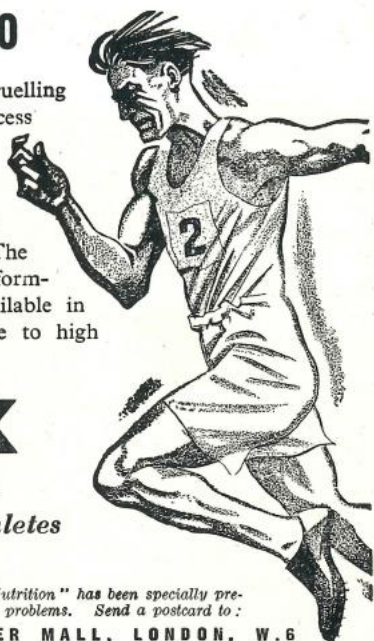

Their post-war Manchester-Blackpool relay record is 5th, 4th, 3rd, 2nd, 3rd; and they finished 4th in the 1951 National London-Brighton.

International honours have been won by C. Straw, S. Welding, A. Worrall, T. Lee, A. Tyrer, T. Fillingham, F. McMinnis and M. Maleedy (England), J. Kelly and G. Edgar (Ireland) and A. Williams (Wales).

In 1949 Sutton formed a women's section which promptly won the 1950 Northern womens relay championship, to add to a record which speaks for itself—that is, if, bearing in mind the small membership, you can believe it. But it is true.
