# Record Entry for National

B IGGEST gathering ever of the Walking fraternity should be seen at Regents Park to-day (Saturday), where the National 10 Miles Championship is to be decided, start 2.30. The programme entry of 414 is a record for the event and the biggest for any walking race in this Country. 35 teams are supporting.

Sheffield will be all out to maintain their unbeaten record in this race since 1949 and, on paper, they look to be much the strongest still. Biggest opposition to them will come from the London "big four" of the present season, Belgrave, Metropolitan, Highgate and Woodford. Roland Hardy will make an effort to score his fifth successive win, his chief rivals being clubmate Lawrence Allen, George Coleman, Bryan Hawkins and Alf Poole.

As has been customary for the past ten vears the Inter-Counties' Championship will be held in conjunction—15 Counties have entered teams—and Middlesex should have a decided victory on current form. Yorkshire look to be next best with Surrey and Essex fighting out third place.

Battersea Park Meeting.

A.A.A. Southern 7 Miles Track Championship will be held at Battersea Park Track on March 24th and the R.W.A. Southern Area Committee are promoting an Open Junior 6 miles and Youths' 3 miles, on the road, at the same meeting. In conjunction with the Junior event a competition for R.W.A. Badges will be held, open to both Juniors and Seniors. These Badges are awarded to competitors completing 6 miles within an Hour.

Trowbridge "Traders" Open 10½ miles is

fixed for Easter Saturday, March 31st, 3.30. Preceding this is a 3½ miles race for Youths

and Juniors.

A valuable trophy which has been hidden away for many years has been brought into the light of day and will be held each year by the first man home in the Colchester to Ipswich Open 18 miles. This is the "T. E. Hammond" Cup, presented by the late Tommy Hammond for competition in the long discontinued Norwich to Ipswich 42 miles—a race in which I remember competing 30 years ago, come Easter

Monday, and with some amusing incidents which space forbids recounting.

EVERY SATURDAY - NINEPENCE

H ONOURS in the National C.C. Championsips at Warwick last week-end were fairly evenly divided between the South and North, though the North were unable to claim an individual winner.

I doubt if anyone would suggest that our international team will be as strong as last year, for not only were several good men absent, but there were "ifs" about many of the top-notchers who did run. However, though many people appear to be pessimistic about our chances next week, I think we have a good enough team to win. I cannot visualise any of the other competing countries packing six in to beat our best, even if we do not provide the individual winner.

A letter from Derek Ibbotson says that his foot, which had turned septic and kept him off training for a week after the Northern race, was again troublesome after the National and he has been advised to rest it for several days. He hopes to be 100 per cent. fit for the International, however.

I was very pleased to see young Langridge win the Junior race, for I have always held a very high opinion of his ability and thought his running in the Southern race a trifle disappointing. There was nothing wrong with his form last Saturday and his tussle with that fine Northern junior, Alan Cocking, was as interesting and exciting as that between Ken and Fred Norris in the Senior race.

In the Youths event we saw an outstanding youngster in John Parker, who should develop into a fine distance runner. This was the first time any athlete from the Bristol area has won a national title and they are justly proud of his fine performances this season.

Despite the illness of Lawrie Richardson, much of whose work was taken over by Jim Peace, the organisation of the National races was pretty good. Everything was close together and the results were worked out quickly and efficiently. The only criticisms heard were about the dressing accommodation, and the marquee in which the recorders worked was filled with a milling throng after each race. Generally speaking, it all went off quite well.

One thing was emphasized, however. As I have said in the past, restriction of entries *must* come, sooner or later. It is only commonsense that you cannot have ninety-odd teams competing over a three miles course, with several hundred competitors finishing within half a mile. In the Youths event they were lining up 150 yards *before* reaching the winning post, with officials trying desperately to stem the flood of runners bearing down on them. It is physically impossible to cope with such a volume of runners finishing in such a short space of time and distance.

Winning the A.A.A. 6 miles championship 1955 because I had to battle both against the conditions and Gordon Pirie, and it was my first A.A.A. title.

How many days a week do you train in (a) Summer and (b) Winter? 6 days per week, summer and winter.

At what time of the day do you normally do your training? Evenings at 7 p.m. except Sunday (morning).

How long do you spend on each training session?

45 to 90 minutes.

Give a brief outline of your training in the Summer season, with a typical week's work: 95 per cent, interval training with only an occasional 3 or 6 laps time trial. A lot of semi-competitive 880 yds. and mile races mid-week against mediocre competition. This year I must make it harder.

Monday: Similar to Sunday or 3-4 x 3 laps (3.18-3.25) 5½min. intervals.

Tuesday: 15-20 x 440yds. (63s.-65s.) with 2min. intervals. Wednesday: 2 x 660yds. (88s.) plus 440yds. (56s.) or 880/mile race.

Thursday: 5 miles with 6 or 8 x 220yds. (27s.28s.).

Friday: Rest.

Saturday: Race 1, 2, 3 or 6Mls.

Sunday: If hard race, 6-8 x 440yds. (63s.-66s.) otherwise 6-8 x 880yds. (2.18) with 2mins. rest or 5-8 x 880yds. (2.18), 440yds. (64s.) with 2 mins. rest.

Give a brief outline of your training in the Winter season, with a typical week's work: Again all interval or fast and slow work on grass verge or road.

Monday: 8-14 mls, fast and slow with accent on 600-1200yds, fast.

Tuesday: 10-14mls, fast and slow before Christmas. 20 x 440 yds, or 300 or 8 x 880yds, on track after Christmas. Wednesday: 7-12 miles with alternate fast and slow 300-440yds. Thursday: 5-6 miles with 6-8 x 220yds, fast on road.

Thursday: 5-6 miles with 6-8 x 220yds, fast on road. Friday: Rest.

Saturday: Race or 8-12 miles fartlek on country.

Sunday: Same as Summer run.

How often do you compete in the competitive season(s)?

Winter—2 races in 3 weeks. Summer—3 races in 2 weeks.

Describe briefly the warming-up you do before competition and time taken: 30-40mins. beforehand, easy jogging for 2-3 miles with 4 or 5 short sprints or strides for 40-100yds. No exercises done. More jogging 10mins. before start.

How many days rest do you prefer before competition?

One, but I ease my training up for 3 days before a big competition, leaving myself wanting to do more.

Name the coaches who have coached you:

Alec White, to whom I owe a great deal of my success, particularly in some of my earlier victories.

Have you any suggestions for improvements in competition or athletics generally?

More action by clubs in asking for better tracks from local authorities. More metric races. More publicity by the Press. More freedom of action by the individual.

What advice would you offer to the young athlete or novice?

There is only one way to the top—the hard way. Remember if you get beaten, you will be beaten more often than you will win and there is always someone better than you. If you are beaten a dozen or twenty times but still keep coming and don't give up, then one day you will suddenly find yourself a champion. Listen to advice from all sides and then try and pick the wheat from the chaff. Good luck.

### INTERNATIONAL WORKERS' FESTIVAL

One hundred athletes from Britain will, together with 30,000 sports men and women from a number of other European and Asian countries, participate in an International Workers' Sports Festival being held in Tel Aviv between the 10th—17th May, and which is being arranged by Hapoel, Israel's leading sports organisation, in celebration of their 30th Anniversary.

# ALL-IRELAND SENIOR CHAMPIONSHIP

# Dundonald, February 25th

The All-Ireland Championships at Dundonald on 25th February, provided yet another triumph for Charlie Owens, of East Antrim. Owens, as usual, went into the lead from the start, and the only man to stay wih him was Messitt, of Donore. Three laps of the nine, however, were enough of Owens' pace for Messitt, and he dropped back, leaving Owens to go on alone to complete a magnificent victory.

The team race resulted in a close win for Donore over East Antrim, the result being in doubt until the last men came home.

The first nine in this race were selected to represent Ireland in the International Championships at Balmoral, on 17th March. It was unfortunate that neither Denis O'Gorman nor John Humphries, who are, with Owens and Harrison, Ireland's leading Cross-Country runners at present, took part in this race and so forfeited their chances of a place in the International team.

Judging our home athletes' performances from Keegan's recent form in the leading English events, it would appear that Owens is the only Irish competitor who has a chance of reaching the first twenty on St. Patrick's Day. However, competing at home may have an invigorating effect on the Irish team.

# THE 1956 NATIONAL

THE course at Warwick, where the 1956 National Cross-Country Championships were held from Warwick Racecourse, provided soft but not heavy going, and with only intermittent light rain falling and little wind, conditions could be said to be quite good.

I cannot recall a National senior race with so many top class athletes either missing or having doubt about their fitness. Another unexpected absentee was Denis O'Gorman, who had a great chance this year but had to withdraw owing to achilles tendon trouble, one of

many so affected this season.

When the big field got away to a fast start, Gordon Pirie was soon in the lead, with Sando, Ken Norris and Derek Ibbotson on his heels. It was not long before Pirie had to give way, however, and by the time they came round at the end of the first lap Ken Norris and Fred Norris were out in front, followed by Derek Ibbotson, Johnny Wild, Eddie Hardy, George Knight, Alan Perkins, Mike Maynard, Derek Walker and Gordon Pirie. Brian Barrett had wrenched an already doubtful ankle and retired. Lake of Small Heath and Beecroft of Clayton-le-Moors, who were up with the leaders for a time, had dropped back.

On the next lap the two leaders opened up a useful gap, but Ibbotson had a bad time, his legs feeling the effects of an R.A.F. Championship course with plenty of plough only three days before, and he dropped many places. Derek Walker and Ken Gates were going well and, with Sando, Knight and Perkins were having a ding-dong battle for places. Pirie and Maynard were steadily going back, but Johnny Wild and Chorlton were up there, and Harry Hicks was not far away. This was the picture as they came round with one lap to go.

It was a great disappointment when Eddie Hardy, suffering from a cold and blocked nasal passages, had to retire at the end of the second lap. Disappointing not only for England, for he has been one of our most reliable runners, but also for himself as this is to be his last season and he dearly wanted to finish up with a last run for his country.

Ken and Fred Norris remained together until well round the final circuit, but eventually, with the finish in sight Ken made his effort and Fred was unable to respond and a gap slowly but surely opened between the two, and at the finish line Ken had an advantage of 30 yards after a grand fight for individual honours. Both received a great ovation from the large crowd.

Derek Ibbotson came through in storming fashion over the last two miles to take third place and Frank Sando shook off his near opponents to finish a very tired fourth—a great effort after his lengthy lay-off. Then came the consistent Alan Perkins, followed by four Northeners, Gates, Walker, Wild and Chorlton. After a small gap came George Knight, very tired and looking all-in. Further back in 15th and 16th places Gordon Pirie beat Mike Maynard in a desperate finish between two runners who, but for injury, would have been that much fitter and made the international team.

The selectors chose the first seven to finish, Peter Driver, who did not run but had shown he is probably England's No. 1 by the way he won the Southern race, and completed the team by picking Alan Chorlton instead of Johnny Wild. The latter selection led to considerable discussion and some criticism, for Wild has been away from such competition for a few years on National Service and on his return to serious running this season he has improved by leaps and bounds with every race and would almost certainly have done still better in the International. It was unfortunate that it had to rest between these two, for Chorlton has been running well and most consistently this year and fully deserves his place.

The team race in the Senior was won very comfortably by Sheffield, who packed in solidly and were always in a strong position. Even had Peter Driver been running, S.L.H. could not have challenged their position. Thames Valley confirmed their Southern form, just in front of S.L.H., and were followed by Bolton and Birchfield, with Aylesford a surprise sixth.

The Junior provided a great race between the rather small Langridge of S.L.H. and the strongly built Cocking of Bramley. Once the field had settled down these two went out in front and shook off their opponents, staying together until the last 50 yards, when Cocking was unable to respond to the S.L.H. boy's final burst.

# C. C. CHAMPIONSHIPS

Salvat (Finchley) was third most of the way and North (Blackpool) improved on his Northern form by holding on to fourth place, just in front of Darchambaud (S.L.H.) who came through on the second lap to make up much ground, as did Corcoran (Macclesfield) and Grubb (Sheffield). Seal of Ponders End, the Southern winner, never looked happy and appeared to be struggling to hold his position in the first dozen.

South London were very easy winners of the team race, with a large margin to spare from Manchester & Dist. Lads Club, with Southgate leading a number of clubs in a close fight for third place.

The Youths race was won by a very promising runner in John Parker of Westbury, who joined his club a little over a year ago

after winning his school cross-country race. He might have been challenged more strongly if Goodwin, the Scottish boy from Bellahouston, had not been crowded out at the start. Goodwin came through well to take second place but did not press the winner at all. Derek Haith did well to finish third but had all his finish run out of him long before the end. Then came Bennett of Wirral and Lydiatte of Hercules, who was the early leader.

Liverpool H. & A.C. confirmed their Northern form by winning the team race but Sheffield were unable to reproduce their district form and were back in 8th place Wirral improved immensely to take second place, with Shaftesbury turning the tables on S.L.H. to finish a close third.
