RACE WALKING

BELGRAVE HARRIERS' 75th Anniversary:

Belgrave Harriers celebrated their 75th Anniversary with a Dinner and Dance last Saturday. Everyone connected with our sport will wish to congratulate this famous club on reaching this landmark in their history. Belgrave have taken a major share of the honours in race walking. Since their formation in 1887 the club has recorded 28 team wins in National Road Walking Championships, and their record reads:—

10 Miles ... 6 Firsts, 2 Seconds, 3 Thirds
20 Miles ... 11 Firsts, 12 Seconds, 8 Thirds
50 Km 11 Firsts, 7 Seconds, 3 Thirds

Their walkers have included both an Olympic Champion (T. W. Green, 1932, 50 Km) and European Champion (S. F. Vickers, 1958, 20 Km), A.A.A. Champions (H. G. Churcher and S. F. Vickers) and R.W.A. Champions (20 Miles: E. W. Hall and S. F. Vickers, 50 Km: T. W. Green, 10 Miles: H. G. Churcher and S. F. Vickers). An exceptional record and one of which the club may be justly proud.

Women's Race Walking: The women's side of our sport rarely makes the headlines. Before the War the centre of activity was the London Area, but recently this moved to the Midlands. Now we learn that the Manx (Isle of Man) A.A.A. are getting increased support for women's race walking. In an endeavour to make progress an Inter-Area Match was held last Saturday over 4 miles at Enfield. This event was won by Sheila Jennings (South) and Midland Counties won the match. The South is very keen to regain its old position and a move is on foot to try to bring this about. Women's walking is controlled by the Women's C.C. and R.W.A.

Today's Major Event: Belgrave Harriers have received the very good entry of 250 individuals and 27 teams for their annual Open 7 Miles. Walkers are reminded that a prompt start at 3 p.m. must be made because of the early darkness at this time of the year. A film show will follow after the prizegiving. Films will include a 30 mins. run of this year's London-Brighton Open.

CRAIG WINS WATERLOO RACE IN RECORD TIME

THE Waterloo Festival of Road Racing promoted by Waterloo H. & A.C. got off to a good start on November 10th when Brian Craig smashed Bruce Tulloh's record by 13 secs. in seemingly impossible conditions for record breaking in the 7 Miles Mammoth Race. Craig's great run proved him right in turning down an international cross-country race in Antwerp to attain his ambition of breaking Tulloh's record set last year.

A field of 369 runners included 25 past and present internationals who started in cold and blustery conditions. Irish champion, Bertie Messitt (Donore), set such a pace that at 2 miles he had pulled Gerry North, Ron Barlow and Brian Craig 40 yds. clear of the rest of the field. Half a mile later North, trying to run the "kick" out of Craig, took the lead and forced the pace. But Craig held on and at 5 miles the two were together 50 yards clear of Messitt, who was 20 yards ahead of Barlow. Meanwhile Dave Swarbrick in 5th place was gradually working his way through the field despite the fast tempo of the race. At this stage it looked as though Donore H., with 4 in 20, were going to take the team race.

At 6 miles Swarbrick's magnificent burst had carried him through to the leaders and the three were having a terrific battle, whilst Barlow and Messitt were having an equally dour struggle for 4th place 100 yards behind them. With half a mile to go, Craig put in a short burst and opened a small gap which he held all the way to the finishing straight, where he kicked again to win by 25 yards from North. Swarbrick finished another 10 yards behind looking remarkably fresh; had he made his effort earlier he might have won the race. Barlow managed to draw clear in the final half-mile to beat Messitt by 50 yards.

The team race was very close with Wallasey only beating Blackpool on the position of their last scorer. Donore, who had looked potential winners, fell back to finish third.

One interesting point—Tom O'Riorden, who was 20th, finished 22nd in the Sao Paulo race, which gives some idea of the standard in the race.

AN icy wind blowing over Milton Road on November 13th played havoc with performances at the Oxford v. Cambridge freshmen's match. The best mark was probably Frank Crozier's 46'3½" shot put, only 1½" shy of David Harrison's shot record. Crozier and team-mate Ross beat the American 50-footer, Bob Baxter. The only double winner was 18-year-old George Tarrant, who won both sprints easily. Cambridge won the match for the third year running.

Just after the start when completing one lap of a field, the course became narrow in places and at times it was possible to run only in single file, which brought everyone to almost a jogging pace, as it was so slippery that as soon as any runner attempted to "move" he could not stop himself falling and bringing down several more behind him. I noticed one runner lying hurt at the foot of a hill, unable to move because runners behind were bearing down on him. I believe there were several sprained ankles caused by this race.

The course was more or less the same as that in 1959 when I remember having to queue up to climb over a stile. I thought someone had decided to change this course which is only suitable for a club race. I am sure others have the same views as myself and would like to hear them.

WOMEN'S A.A.A. SENIOR COACHING AWARD

THE W.A.A.A. has experienced, during the last few years, a dearth of applicants for examination for the W.A.A.A. Senior Coaching Award. In order to encourage more women to apply for examination at this level, a new type of Senior Award has been instituted, namely the W.A.A.A. General Senior Coaching Award. A candidate may now ask to be examined in one event only or in all events at a slightly lower level.

The "one event" award is for the specialist coach in any of the women's events. It is made to W.A.A.A. coaches who show they have the knowledge and ability to coach up to National or International level in that event. In this examination, a high standard is expected, in both the written paper and the practical test.

The "general" award is designed for the more "all round" coach. It is made to W.A.A.A. coaches who have already obtained the W.A.A.A. Coaching Award in all events and who satisfy the examiners of their knowledge and ability to coach all events up to a high standard.

The syllabus for the General Senior Award is similar to that for the "one event" award, except that it is less specific. Both syllabi include knowledge of

1. the principles of the mechanics on which the technique of the event or events is based,
2. the rules of competition of the event or events and their interpretation,
3. methods of training and period and seasonal schedules,
4. the physiological, statistical and historical background of the event,
5. the exponents of the event or events in present and recent times, as well as
6. the technique of the events and the performance method, and
7. the observation and correction of faults.

The exam falls into two parts. There is first the written paper, of three hours duration, taken in the candidate's home area under the supervision of an invigilator accepted by the W.A.A.A. On passing this test, the candidate then proceeds to the practical test, in which he or she will be asked to coach an athlete of national or international standard, and may be asked to comment on film loops. For the General Award, the candidate will be asked to coach several athletes in a selection of events.

Prior to applying for examination at this level, the candidate will need to be 22 years of age, and have held the W.A.A.A. Coaching

Award for 2 years. This does not apply to a candidate who is already a A.A.A. Honorary Senior Coach. Holders of this Award will be set a special form of examination.

The candidate will find it advisable to have attended one or more Advanced Coaching Courses, such as the W.A.A.A. Summer School, to have had a great deal of coaching experience and to have done a certain amount of reading on and around the event and on athletics in general. To assist future candidates, a suggested book-list is available from the W.A.A.A. Coaching Advisor. The fee for the exam is 10 shillings and on obtaining the award, the successful coach may purchase and wear the W.A.A.A. Senior Coach badge.

The examination is held annually, the written paper being taken on the second Saturday in February. The date next year is February 9th, 1963, but any coaches who attend the W.A.A.A. Summer School at Lilleshall from August 10th to August 17th, 1963, may, if they wish, sit for the written examination at the end of the course, but they will be expected to have had considerable coaching experience and have done some reading before they come to the course.

What are W.A.A.A. Senior Coaches requested to do after they have qualified? As the W.A.A.A. Coaching Scheme is different from the A.A.A. Coaching Scheme, having no professional coaches, the W.A.A.A. uses its Senior Coaches to examine candidates for the W.A.A.A. Coaching Award, to organise or help to run courses and to give lectures, as well as to coach athletes at a high level. It is to be hoped that successful candidates will be willing to assist in these ways. The W.A.A.A. badly needs more Senior Coaches, especially of the fair sex. At the moment, it is the same few "willing horses" who are doing the work, (and the W.A.A.A. is extremely grateful to them) but more are needed to spread the load, as well as to stand the work of the W.A.A.A. Coaching Scheme. There are large areas of the country where we have no Senior Coach and very few W.A.A.A. coaches, but at the same time, many girl and women athletes needing and wishing to be coached.
