HANDICAPPING

MR. Bernard Apps, of Redhill and Reigate A.C. asks me to draw attention to "the mess known as handicapping, through which cups, medals, bedside lamps, frying pans, etc., etc., are presented to the winners in this lucky draw."

Mr. Apps states that many of these so-called handicap races are quite ridiculous and the present system does not fulfil its aim of giving every competitor a fair chance. He suggests a remedy for road races, with the R.R.C. or similar body arranging handicaps based on carefully collected performances, perhaps on a standard 10 miles, with the handicap adjusted up or down similar to a golfer's handicap. Then, says Mr. Apps, who describes the R.R.C. system of standards and certificates as "a real incentive for even the lowly plodder," "one could be proud of one's handicap and seek to lower it instead of 'cook' it."

While sharing Mr. Apps' admiration for the R.R.C., I cannot see how it would be more difficult to "cook" a handicap based on this system than it is at present, should a runner wish to do so—and I don't think many road runners do. And who is going to do all the work? Ernest Neville and his band of helpers put in a lot of hours now, all voluntary, and I fear that any such extra work would mean employing labour, which is a costly affair.

This handicapping business is a hoary old chestnut which cropped up many years ago, when there were far more handicap events than now, with great regularity. The crux of the matter—apart from any athletes who try to "cook" their handicap, is whether an athlete's mark should be based on what the handicapper knows he can do, or on his last mark in an open event. If an athlete competes only seldom in handicap events, he may well be up to international standard, yet on the latter basis could well be given a novice mark. For this reason I have always been against this basis of working out handicaps, though many county handicappers still work to this idea—I have no idea what the "official" viewpoint is here, for it is never stated!

One classic example of this method of handicapping this season has been Jim Hogan of the Poly H. I would be the last to begrudge Jim all the prizes he has won—his fine running this year has been worthy of them all—but the remarks amongst the other athletes when he has been given 172 yards in the mile and other quite stupid marks, can well be imagined and only tend to bolster up Mr. Apps' remarks. Perhaps a handicapper would care to give his views?

WALKING

Highgate H. Open 7 Miles

ARTHUR THOMSON (Met.) completed the Highgate double on Saturday by taking the 7 Miles Road Walk after his One-Hour success a month earlier. The big field of 220 started the stiff $\frac{3}{4}$ mile climb of West Hill and light-weight George Williams, of Belgrave, breasted the top ahead of Thomson, Paul Nihill, Bob Clark, Rudy Haluza, John Godbeer, Ray Middleton and John Northcott. Down North Hill Godbeer was ruled out as was also Mel Pope, the Welsh champion. On the flat mile along the A1, Williams, walking very well indeed, increased his lead with Arthur Thomson well established in second place. Restarting the undulations at three miles Thomson began to hold Williams and then at four miles began to close the gap. From that point Thomson looked the winner and he went by to finish 100 yards in front in 52m. 15s., time beaten over this course only by George Coleman, Eric Hall, Ken Matthews and Stan Vickers. Williams clocked 52.39 and Clark last year's winner was third in 53.24. Nihill lost a couple of places and Ron Wallwork (53.35), walking in his best style, beat Middleton and Northcott in a close fight for fourth place.

Belgrave won the team race by three points from Met., for whom Shaun Lightman and Martin Higgins of the winning Junior team of the week before put up exceptionally good performances. This also gave them 1st and 2nd places in the handicap. It was very pleasing to see a team competing again from Cambridge University and Andrew Fowler, of Wycombe Phoenix H., the mainspring of the effort, is very keen to further revive the C.U.A.C. Walking Section. Loughborough College were also well represented and one of the old time champion walking Clubs in Herne Hill Harriers returned as a team for the first time for about 30 years. For them A. Jones, a most promising walker, failed by only 13 seconds to beat the hour.

found a successor to take over as Surrey W.C. Race Hon. Secretary in Bill Traer, the Blackheath Treasurer, and with the London to Brighton, the "Godstone" and numerous smaller events to organise, not to mention the Brighton and Back every fourth year, this is a most onerous job to undertake. "Ding-Dong" has put in many years of hard work and deserves the thanks not only of his club but of all long-distance walkers. New S.W.C. President is Edgar Frost, still a competitor but finding time to encourage and transport the younger up-and-coming Surrey boys to outlying events. Gen. Sec. is still Kent Best and with "Dicky" Green the hard-working Captain.

This Saturday. The Midland Winter League programme starts with a five miles at Leicester. Preceding the senior race is the Midland Youths' 3 miles and Junior 5 miles Championships.

AUSTRALIAN NEWS

ROSS FILSHIE (Melbourne University) added 4½ in. to his Australian pole vault record at Stawell, on October 7th, when he cleared 14ft. 4½ in. This vault lifted Filshie to number-one spot in the British Commonwealth.

Filshie, who turned 22 on Oct. 13, is 5ft. 10in. tall and weighs 12st. He started vaulting in 1957, set his old record in February, 1960, and is using an American fibreglass pole to-day. There is little doubt that Filshie will improve considerably on his new record—Ross himself feels he will break the Empire record, and approach 15ft. next year.

Competing in his first marathon, Tony Cook won the Victorian State title in Melbourne on Oct. 14, in 2:28.41. Cook won from Norm Duff 2:29.35 and Fred Lester 2:38.36.

Alf O'Connor, the wonderful 55-year-old solicitor, was fourth — and again broke his personal record with a time of 2:46.31. It was Alf's third marathon in two months—his previous times being 2:50.11 and 2:47.40.

Others inside 3hrs. were Ron Clarke (who had a brief flash of track form early in 1956 when, at 18, he ran a 4:06.8 mile) 2:53.09, Geoff Warren (former star 3-miler) 2:53.43, George Breen (better known as a long distance walker) 2:54.49 and Bob Horman 2:58.23. It was rather humid weather, and heavy rain fell during much of the race. Tom Kelly, who on Sept. 28 won the Seoul International, withdrew at 20 miles.

Another class schoolboy half-miler has popped up in Sydney—Terry Austin, 17, who won the Great Public Schools' open title in 1:54.5 on Sydney Cricket Ground on Oct. 14. Other good marks at this meet were: 100 and 220yds., Steven Warr 10.0 and 21.9; 440yds., Bill Blogg 49.3 (also 120yd. hurdles, 3ft. 3in., in 14.8), mile R. Levine 4:29.2.

At the Queensland G.P.S. meet in

Brisbane, Ian Moore won the 12lb. shot put with a record 55ft. 3½ in., Peter Balthes won the 100yds. in 9.9, Lloyd Shield the 880yds. in 1:59.6 and Terry Mulholland the mile in 4:28.6. At a later schools meeting, Shields beat Mulholland over the mile in 4:27.8, and Balthes won the 39in. hurdles in 14.4.

Brisbane girls' meeting: Brenda Cox and Deima McCracken, 100yds. 11.0, and Agnes De Rooy, 16, high jump 5ft. 1½ in.

In time trials in Melbourne, Pam Kilborn twice ran 80 metre hurdles in 10.8. Pam, who holds the Australian pentathlon record of 4316 pts., last summer equalled Norma Thrower's Australian hurdles record of 10.6. A 20ft. broad jumper, to, Pam could be one of the outstanding performers here during the 1961-62 track season.

PETER WELLS

Dear Sir,

Since Peter Wells' various "representations" have come up for discussion from time to time recently you may be interested to have, for the record, the facts.

Peter was born in London and has, as far as the I.A.A.F. are concerned, a Great Britain qualification. In 1950 he represented England at the Empire Games at Auckland and, liking the country, decided to stay there. In 1952 he was selected to represent Britain at the Helsinki Olympics and could not in fact have represented New Zealand even had he so wished.

In the Empire Games, a domestic competition, I.A.A.F. recognition is ignored—for example the Channel Islands entered their own team at Cardiff—and by a "family agreement" Peter Wells jumped at Vancouver in 1954 in New Zealand colours. Nevertheless at the Olympic Games in Melbourne in 1956 he again represented Britain, for which country he was "cup-tied."

Peter Wells has not, therefore, represented any country other than Great Britain in international competition.

PORTSMOUTH SMASH BRISTOL-WESTON RECORD

NO-ONE could possibly quarrel with the claim that the 12th Bristol-Weston and Back Relay on October 28th was the greatest athletic event ever seen in the West Country.

The travel involved by the 38 competing teams adds up to several thousand miles. At considerable expense Donore Harriers flew in from Dublin with the object of establishing just how they stand in relation to the best clubs in this country. Other welcome newcomers were Leicester Colleges of Art and Technology, Notts A.C., Leamington C. and A.C., and Lozells H.

A Portsmouth versus Derby showdown over an eight-man relay brought out twice the previous year's traffic and the harvest from the race was an amazing new course record plus one new stage record by Portsmouth, and a new return journey record plus two fresh stage records by Derby. (Records in brackets).

Stage 1. (24.11). With barely a mile to go eight runners looked like dead-heating, but Portsmouth's Dave Cooke managed to ease away, followed surprisingly by his "B" team clubmate T. F. Johnston, with J. Edwards (Bristol) the closest of thirds, and Godiva and Derby only seconds behind. 1, D. Cooke (Ports) 24.27; 2, T. Johnston (Ports "B") 24.46; 3, J. Edwards (Bris) 24.47.

Stage 2. (24.42). Eddie Strong of Bristol outclassed even Basil Heatley for the second best performance of the day to put his club in front of Portsmouth, but experienced Ton Hayden made sure that no-one else caught him. WOODFORD GREEN TAKE CHELMSFORD RELAY

WOODFORD GREEN A.C., with a well-balanced team, won a thoroughly deserved victory in the 14th annual Chelmsford Road Relay on October 28th.

David Gibson (14.52) gave City of Rochester a lead of 120 yards on the first lap, and was followed home by B. Smyth (Welwyn) 15.12, C. Ward (Colchester) 15.15, S. Purkis (Romford) 15.17 and T. Smith (Ipswich) 15.17. Strangely enough, the teams to finish eventually 1st, 2nd and 3rd, Woodford, Blackheath and Chelmsford, were bunched together 12th (Phipps 15.41), 11th (Catley 15.40) and 13th (Bailey 15.42) at this point.

Rochester were still 120 yds. out in front at the end of lap 2, thanks to Reynolds (15.22), but some startling changes had taken place behind them. Batty brought Thurrock from 20th to 2nd with a great run of 14.36, only 2 sec. outside the record, and Major brought Woodford from 12th to 3rd with 14.56. Then came Ponders End (McIntyre 15.12), Chelmsford (Bell 15.14) and Belgrave (Shippen 15.38). On this leg John Pettitt brought Aylesford from 30th to 7th with 14.42 and Nat Fisher moved Eton Manor up from 35th to 11th with 14.54.

On the third lap Rochester dropped back to third, Foxley being passed by Crump, of Woodford (15.17) and Herring, of Blackheath (14.49). Belgrave (Linstead 15.21) were 4th, Chelmsford (Courtman 15.47) 5th and Eton Manor (Cole 15.28) 6th.

On the fourth leg there was still not a great deal in it. Kerr had a good run for Belgrave (15.05) which took them up to second place 14sec. behind the leaders, with Blackheath (Jackson) 19sec. behind in third place, followed by Essex Beagles for whom George Knight had run a fine race to bring his club up six places, Rochester and Ilford, for whom Alan Perkins had come up seven places with a run of 15.05.

On lap 5 Buddy Edelen put up the fastest time of the day, despite running a large part of the course without shoes, to take Chelmsford from 9th to 4th. Woodford (Tribe 15.09) had now increased their lead to three-quarters of a minute, Belgrave were still second 12sec. ahead of Blackheath, and Chelmsford were followed by Essex Beagles and Ilford.

On the final lap Dave Chapman went right away to bring Woodford home easy winners from Blackheath, with Chelmsford

running into a popular third for the first time in their own promotion. Charlie Dabbs found this distance a bit short for him and Belgrave dropped to 5th behind Essex Beagles.

Fifty-six teams started and forty-four finished. Blackheath "B" were leading the "B" teams home in 16th place after the fifth lap but had no last man to carry on and failed to finish.

Chelmsford are to be congratulated on the excellence of their organisation, which is first class. This, the course, accommodation and refreshments have all helped to make the Chelmsford Relay one of the most popular on the calendar—next year's date, October 27th 1962.
